As many of you may have heard, long-time Kiwanian Timothy Daly passed away on February 4, 2025. Tim, or as many knew him, Mr. Daly, was a mentor to countless Key Club and Circle K members over his 35 years of service

to our District in his roles as Key Club Faculty Advisor and District Financial Counselor as well as Circle K District Administrator for 27 years of those years. During this time he shaped and inspired the lives of so many.

Tim, alongside George Whitney, mentored me not only during my time in Key Club but also when I joined Kiwanis. Their guidance was a driving force behind my decision to become a Kiwanian, and I owe them so much for the leadership skills they instilled in me. I wanted to give other students the same opportunities that I had growing up, and Tim's mentorship was instrumental in that journey.

As a Kiwanian, serving alongside Tim as Circle K Financial Counselor, I learned so much about what it truly means to be a mentor. The lessons he taught me continue to shape the way I interact with and

support students today, both in Kiwanis and in my professional life. Even after he passed the Circle K District Administrator baton to me, Tim remained a guiding presence, was always willing to listen and offer advice when needed.

As I approach 15 years as a Kiwanian, I've come to understand that we often don't realize the impact we're having on others, but that impact is happening nonetheless. We may learn of it at unexpected times, or we might never even know how far it stretches. Though it has been several years since Tim and George led our student service leadership organizations, their legacy continues to live on in the many leaders who have been influenced by their work, not only in our District but across other Kiwanis Districts as well.

I hope all Kiwanians in this District and beyond continue to leave a similar lasting impact on the leaders of tomorrow. Thank you Mr. Daly for the lasting impression you have left on me and on this District. You will be deeply missed, but your legacy will continue to inspire.



## Did you know...? By Matt Barrett, District Risk Manager

In order for our present insurance to apply to club events that involve the use of contractors, promoters or other service providers that conduct activities or services on our behalf, the local sponsoring Kiwanis club must collect certificates of insurance. This procedure applies anytime a service is provided to Kiwanis by someone or an organization that normally would

derive income from such a service as part of their normal business.

Examples of this include but are not limited to carnivals, circuses, concerts, air shows, rodeos and talent shows. If a location requests a certificate of insurance from the Kiwanis club, those can be requested through Kiwanis International through this <u>form</u>. Rember, the general liability insurance is included as part of membership dues,
