

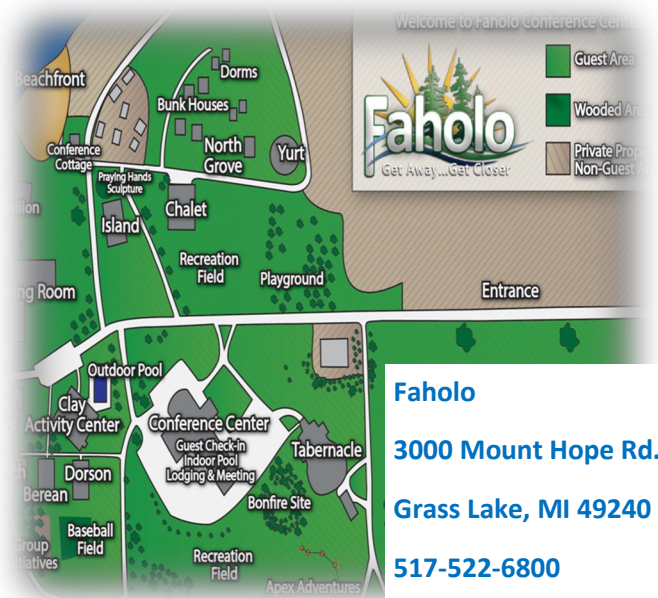
KEY LEADER®
