Then we heard from Renea Callery, when she was present, announcing her candidacy to run for Governor-elect in August at our District Convention.



## **Book Recommendations**

In the last issue of the Michigan Builder I started with 3 book recommendations related to developing yourself and your leadership abilities. I will continue in this issue with the remaining 3 books that are related to ideas and ways to improve your club so it will remain relevant and vital in your community.

## The third book is Leading Change

by John Kotter

In the book he goes through an 8-step process to achieve change. Many times change does not occur because a step is not fully completed or skipped.

- 1. Establish a sense of urgency
- 2. Create a guiding coalition that can work as a team and has enough power to lead change
- 3. Develop a vision and strategy. The vision must direct the change wanted and the strategies must achieve the vision
- 4. Communicate the change vision. Every vehicle possible must be used to constantly communicate the vision and strategies. Model behavior should be expected of employees to accomplish the change
- 5. Empower broad-based action. Get rid of obstacles. Change the systems that undermine the change vision. Encourage risk-taking
- 6. Generate short-term wins. Create a plan for visible improvements or wins. Visibly recognize and reward people who made these wins possible
- 7. Consolidate gains and produce more change. This produces increased credibility to change all systems and structures. Develop people who can implement change
- 8. Anchor these new approaches in the culture. Articulate connections between new behaviors and organization success. Ensure leadership development and succession

#### The fifth book is Almost Isn't Good Enough by Wayne Elsey

Wayne Elsey who founded Funds2Orgs (who we used to collect shoes several years ago) talks about how non-profits should behave to accomplish more. He believes that non-profits need to be run more like businesses in many ways. Here are some ways to view how your club could be run and managed that may lead to improvement.

- Eliminate distractions by practicing absolute clarity. Be clear and simple about your objectives and goals
- Build the community you want, not the one you can afford. Get what you pay for. Invest in people.
- Sustain impact by engaging others rather than creating awareness. Invite and empower others to participate in the work.
- Make decisions to take you where you want to go. Action is the most important element of success
- Get off the couch. Follow through on decisions. Stop talking and start doing
- Look for solutions bigger than the problem. Start with how to solve, not if. Solve to make an impact.
- Progress only comes through action. You want to accomplish something specific, measurable and significant.
- No more excuses. Look at a challenge like this:
  - o Find a way to solve it.
  - o Stop wasting time if you can't fix it.
  - o Invent a solution that hasn't been considered
- Get comfortable with chaos. Managing an organization never leads to innovation. Empowering does.
- Look out the windshield, not the rearview mirror. Don't let the unknowns paralyze you from taking action. Don't let the bureaucracy interrupt progress.

## The sixth book is The Seven Habits of Highly Effective People

#### by Gary Chapman

The book The Five Love Languages can be a useful way to build relationships with the members of your club and to recognize and reward them for their efforts. By learning what their primary love language is, we can acknowledge them in a way that is meaningful.

#### The five love languages are:

- o Quality Time
- o Words of Affirmation
- o Gifts
- You can learn more about each one in the book. Here are some general observations:




Learn other people's primary love language and reward them that way instead of yours. An example of this is knowing people who don't drink (including me) who have received bottles of wine or liquor as a thank you. #### **District Convention Delegate Certification Form**

Here is the form on which to designate your club's delegates and alternates to the 105<sup>th</sup> Annual Michigan District Convention, to be held at the Doubletree Hotel in Bay City beginning August 25 and ending August 28, 2022.

District Bylaws provide the following in Article VI, Sections 6-9:

**Section 6.** At any District convention, each club shall be entitled to seat up to three (3) delegates, two (2) of whom should be the club president and president-designate, as well as nominate three alternates who may serve if any delegate is absent. Club delegates and alternates shall be active members of the clubs they represent. However, the Lieutenant Governor or a past Lieutenant Governor may represent any club in their division not otherwise represented by three delegates. Delegates shall be elected by each club prior to the convention and certified to the District by the club president and secretary. A current or past Lieutenant Governor representing a club may be certified by the Credentials Committee, or its designee.

**Section 7.** Official delegates of a newly organized club shall be granted full privileges at District conventions after the charter has been approved by the Kiwanis International Board of Trustees, even if it has not been formally presented to the club.

**Section 8.** All officers, standing committee chairpersons, and past Governors of the District who are active members of a club in the District shall be delegates-at-large to all District conventions.

Section 9. To be accredited, a delegate must have paid a convention registration fee, if such is required.

Delegates-at-Large need to complete the form ONLY if they plan to represent a specific club.

Clubs are advised NOT to name a 2021-22 Lt. Governor, 2021-22 District Officer or Past District Governor who is a member of your club, as either a delegate or alternate, since they are already Delegates-at-Large.

If you desire to have the current or past Lt. Governor, or Past District Secretary in your Division represent your club as one of your delegates, the same form will be used to certify them as delegates.

Please complete and return the signed form to the District Office at the earliest possible date, but by August 15, 2022.

No delegate may receive credentials for any club that has any indebtedness to Kiwanis International or the Michigan District.






