


Come One, Come All!

Submission deadline: September 15

All contest entries must be submitted using the online submission form by September 15. Email a copy of your entry (including all the same information required by the online form) to Amy Urick to ensure that your entry will be included in our Michigan District judging and display at the Convention.

If your club does not have a Vimeo or YouTube account, **or if you need any help at all**, please contact Amy Urick. Assistance is available for creating, formatting or uploading your entries.

If you have a scrapbook or poster in hardcopy form only, please contact Amy Urick for help. Hard copies can be mailed to Amy, but they MUST be received BEFORE September 1st, and there is no guarantee that you can receive your original back. It's better if you digitize it, and it's easy! Contact Amy if you need help.

Electronic submission links are shared with district administrators for district judging. After display and judging at our Convention, Amy will email a list of district award winners to Kiwanis International by September 30.

Award winners will be posted on the website, shared on social media and announced in the the advisor and district administrator e-newsletters in Mid-November, 2022. Electronic recognition is emailed to club advisors of award recipients in Mid-January, 2023.

Honoring Advisors, Clubs and Members:

Often the work of club advisors and individual members goes unnoticed. The Awards and Recognition website includes several certificates you can use to honor their outstanding work.

Identify your club's successes throughout the year, and gain the opportunity to earn either an "Honored Club" or "Distinguished Club" electronic badge along with social media graphics which can be posted online in recognition of the club's accomplishments. **The Annual Achievement Report is at the bottom of the Award and Recognition website and must be completed by October 15, 2022 to be considered for recognition.**

Midland Aktion Club and Signature Service Project

One activity we did was adding dye to homemade play dough balls and giving them to special needs children at their school. Some of our fun activities scheduled for this summer include kayaking, a baseball game (we have a triple A team here) and a picnic (pizza is always a big hit).

We had the director of Aarons Gifts From Home speak to our club. Below are photos of Midland Aktion Club members assembling care packages for soldiers serving abroad. Aarons Gifts From Home will send these care packages to soldiers in all the services. Care packages included food, snacks, personal hygiene items and entertainment, for example books, toys, DVDs, CDs as well as other items, which include batteries, socks, scarfs, hats, blankets, pillows, and hand warmers to any and all currently deployed military personnel on a year round basis. Simply, to improve the morale of American Troops serving abroad by sending care packages to deployed troops. Care packages have been to Afghanistan, Iraq, Kuwait, Bahrain, Korea, Japan, Cuba, Africa and ships at sea, wherever soldiers are on deployment.

This nonprofit Aarons Gifts From Home was begun by the parents of Aaron Ullom who was killed in action while serving in Afghanistan in July 2011. The nonprofit sends care packages to soldiers serving abroad. Get more information, request a care package for a soldier you know or donate by using the website **aaronsgiftsfromhome.com**

History and Activity of Aktion Club in Detroit



The Detroit Helping-Out Aktion Club was chartered on September 19, 2011. Starting an Aktion Club was one of the goals as president of the Detroit Number One Kiwanis Club. I approached Rev. Faith Fowler of Cass Community Social Services for help. Cass Community Social Services operated a day program with adults from foster care homes and others who had been labeled "developmentally disabled." I knew that Aktion Club would enrich the day program for these special needs people.

In early 2011, through a process of self-selection, 21 people signed up to join the club. The club members selected the club name because they saw their purpose as "helping out". Members select all the activities. Our service activities began with picking up trash in the neighborhood. At Christmas,

we carol at the Methodist retirement Home in Downtown Detroit and each Memorial Day, the group sings at the John Dingell Veterans Hospital.

A favorite activity was collecting returnable bottles and cans for the Kiwanis Eliminate (maternal neonatal tetanus) Project. And we labeled books for the Kiwanis signature project. We also sent cards to hospitalized veterans. And our dance group entertained at the Kiwanis 100th anniversary party.
