3-STEP Process

Over the past year and for the near future the focus for Michigan Kiwanis will be on membership. Adding members is crucial to the future success of our District. One way is by adding members to our existing clubs. We have scheduled and will schedule boosts to help your club do this if you want. For adding members to your club, this is a three-step process. The first step is for the club to prepare for adding members. The second step is the actual process of contacting and asking potential members to join your club. The third step is to make them feel welcome and become an integral part of your club.

Let's talk about the first step: preparing your club. Over the past 8 years of writing columns for the Builder, I have talked about this several times. I believe many of these ideas are still productive so let me dip into the past with some of these thoughts.

1. Go out in the community and talk to people about Kiwanis.

Be proactive. Don't wait for people to read about Kiwanis or stumble onto your website. Go out and network with various groups. At one of the Chamber events, talk about Kiwanis instead of your business. Approach other non-profits, churches, schools, etc. and brainstorm on projects you can work on together. When I am at networking events, I get a lot more interest representing Kiwanis than I ever did wearing my business badge. Remember, you want to find out what their interests are before you let them know about Kiwanis. Then if it is appropriate, invite them to join you at a meeting or service project. Wear something with a Kiwanis logo or tag line. This may get a conversation started about what is Kiwanis. Decide on the demographic you want to attract to your club. Then go to places they are and build relationships. It's not about the single ask and they will join. Building the relationship is all part of the process.

2. Make sure your meeting is one that people want to attend.

When visitors arrive at your club are they greeted by multiple people, not just one or two? Are they made to feel welcome? Are your meetings fun? Are they just about business? Are there too many inside jokes and sarcastic remarks that you may understand, but visitors would not? Imagine if you were a visitor to your club, would want to join? Are you proud of your club?

We can have all kinds of programs, spend all kinds of money and take all kinds of time to get people interested in attending their local Kiwanis club meeting. The question is "What are they going to see when they get there?" The marketing campaign may be wonderful, but if the product is not attractive, results will be disappointing.

This is where the "Mystery Shopper" comes in. Between now and the end of September each club should consider trying this program. We may all think we have good or great clubs, but how do we appear to new people attending the meeting?

Here are the rules for the "Mystery Shopper":

1. Only one person in the club should know who the Mystery Shopper is but not necessarily be there when he/she is attending your meeting. That should be the person who receives the report.
2. The Mystery Shopper should not attend the meeting as a guest of anyone. She should say she heard about the club from others or found information on the website, etc.
3. The Mystery Shopper should evaluate the club on criteria/areas you want feedback on. Different clubs may have different areas that need attention.
4. The Mystery Shopper should be from the demographic group you are trying to attract.
5. If your club is going to do this, it must be open to whatever the report says and not get defensive.

Your District Leadership team is committed to growing Kiwanis in Michigan this year. By implementing some of these ideas your club will have a greater chance of success in identifying and attracting potential members. We need Kiwanis members and clubs to do this, show them a great Kiwanis experience and keep them as members for many years to come.

It's a great way to stay connected!

Social media is something people are using every day and most likely multiple times a day. It's a great way to stay connected to those near and far, learn about local events in your area and be a great place for personal expression. It's also a wonderful way to promote your Kiwanis club and share more about the wonderful things you are doing in your community each and every day.

The challenge with social media is that attention doesn't always equal membership growth. Even the potential members that reach out to you through social media need to be guided into membership. Here are a few ways to use social media to help grow your club's membership:

- 1. RESPOND QUICKLY AND OFFER LOTS OF DETAILS.** Respond to messages within 24 hours and provide necessary context to give the person insight to what they will experience when meeting you.
- 1. KEEP YOUR SOCIAL MEDIA UP TO DATE.** A potential member isn't going to know about what your club is all about if you aren't posting regularly. Try to post content on your channels at least once a week that gives a potential member an idea of what your club does in the community and the impact you are making throughout the year.
- 1. DO SOME ADVERTISING!** Utilize the advertising opportunities on each platform to reach more people in your area. A small amount of money can go a long way in getting your message to more people.

KIWANIS CLUB OF EAST MEADOW KIWANIS INTERNATIONAL PRESIDENT

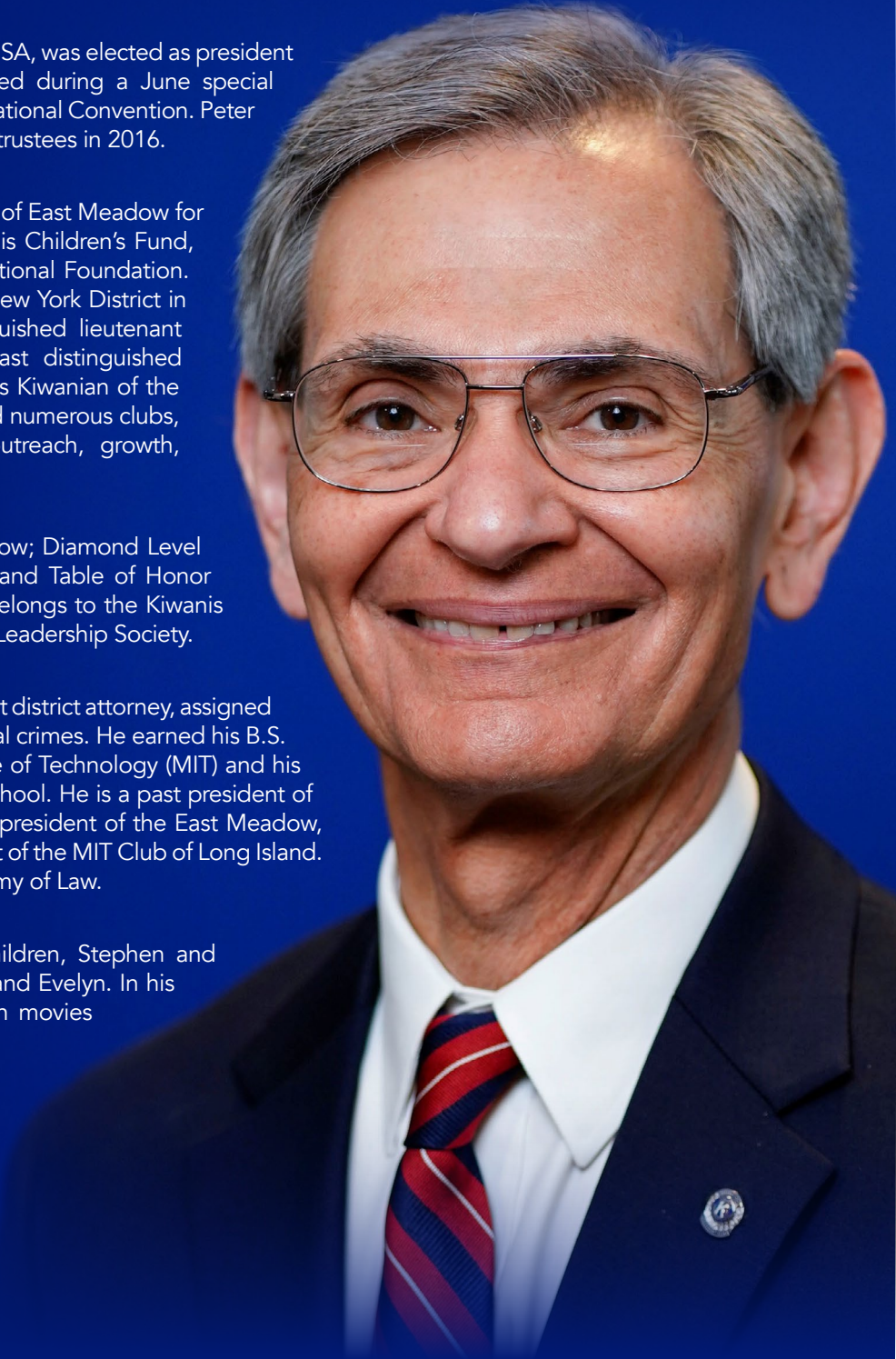

Now retired, Peter was employed as an assistant district attorney, assigned to the investigation and prosecution of financial crimes. He earned his B.S. in economics from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) and his law degree from the Cornell University Law School. He is a past president of the Nassau County, NY Bar Association; past president of the East Meadow, NY Chamber of Commerce; and past president of the MIT Club of Long Island. Peter is also a past dean of the Nassau Academy of Law.

Peter and his wife Karen have two adult children, Stephen and Cathy, and three grandchildren, Sam, Henry, and Evelyn. In his free time, Peter likes to exercise, read, watch movies and sports and listen to old time radio.

Across this state and nation, too many boys and girls go without a bed – or even a pillow – to sleep on. These children end up sleeping on couches, blankets, and even floors. This can affect their happiness and health.

That's where Sleep in Heavenly Peace (SHP) comes in. It's a group of volunteers dedicated to building, assembling and delivering top-notch bunk beds to children and families in need. SHP started in a garage with the build of one bed for a single family. With wood left over from the first bunk, the question was, "Who else could benefit from this bunk?" Once posted on Facebook, there were requests from needy families and people eager to help and volunteer. It was no longer a question of "who?", but "how many?"

We were introduced to SHP at the Michigan District's 2021 convention in Ann Arbor, where they were an exhibitor and presenter. It caught the attention of a few Division 16 Kiwanians looking for a Division-wide hands-on project. It didn't take long to get the word out, not only to Division 16 clubs, but Division 18 clubs, local businesses, community organizations, and community leaders.

In a matter of only a few months, Kiwanis raised enough money to build 38 beds. Then, on an overcast and sometimes rainy day in May, over 75 volunteers gathered under a pavilion at Lake Lansing Park South to build those beds. It was great to be serving the children of the Lansing area! In less than three hours, 75 volunteers sanded, drilled, assembled, and stained enough wood to make 50 beds (SHP had some materials and money left over from previous builds)!

SHP provided all the power and hand tools, personal protective equipment, jigs and patterns...everything needed to build beds except the lumber. That's where Kiwanis came in! Each bed costs \$250 start to finish...it includes the cost of materials, a mattress, a pillow, a set of sheets, a comforter or blanket, delivery and set up. All SHP needs is enough money to fund a minimum of 20 beds (\$5,000) and volunteers on build day and they will set up a build

Delivery of the beds is the next step. SHP vets the applicants to determine need. And, it takes only a couple of hours to have the bed set up in the child's home.

Thanks go to Division 16 and 18 clubs who donated money and volunteered on build day. Another "thank you" to community organizations and businesses that included Tuesday Toolmen, Lansing Fire Department, Ingham County Sheriff's Department, South Lansing Business Association, Give a Kid a Project, and Cut Nail Woodworking. And, we couldn't do it without Ingham County Parks who allowed us to use their shelter and waived the parking fee for this event.
