KIWANIS-KEY CLUB RELATIONS

Kiwanians play an important role in the success of a Key Club. When analyzing our most prolific and involved Key Clubs, we can spot a common thread: the strong support of their sponsoring Kiwanis club. What does this strong Kiwanis/Key Club connection look like? Having Key Club officers and/or members present at Kiwanis meetings does a great deal in pulling the bond closer between both clubs. It not only helps the Kiwanis club stay updated on what the Key Club is working on, but also benefits the Key Club to learn more about their sponsoring Kiwanis club! Sometimes, Key Club officers are not aware they can attend Kiwanis meetings, so it would be helpful to reach out after Key Club elections and invite them to come! If the Kiwanis club has any upcoming events or service projects, extending that invitation to the Key Club members would be a great way to get some extra volunteers for the event and draw that connection even closer. Key Clubbers may need extra support from the Kiwanis club as well. Whether this be related to service projects or financial aid, we appreciate any support the club may be able to provide for things like help setting up community events or funding to attend district and international conventions.







Convention Sponsorship

Aktion Club is the only service club for adults with disabilities. More than 6,433 adults with disabilities around the world are involved in this Kiwanis-family program, developing leadership skills while working with others to help those in need. Aktion Club empowers members to be themselves, work together with friends and implement plans through action.

Michigan District Aktion Club Convention (AktionCON) is the highlight of the year. Our members look forward to coming together each fall to share successes, discuss challenges, learn about leadership, work together on a service project and have fun staying overnight at a camp. Convention expenditures range from \$70-100 per attendee, but the full cost would be prohibitive for most members, especially those who need their caregivers with them. AktionCON charges just \$35 per attendee, and rely on our generous sponsors to make it happen. Individuals, businesses, clubs and foundations have supported our event by making their tax deductible donation to the Michigan District Kiwanis Foundation.






