






Circle K International (CKI) is the premier collegiate and university community service, leadership development, and friendship organization in the world.







- * Governor or Lt. Governor will be given the opportunity to address the club at the time of any visit. They may present prepared remarks not to exceed three minutes relating to the District, the Division and/or the Club.
- * Governor or Lt. Governor will schedule with the Club President his/her visits to a Club Meeting or a Club Board Meeting. Lt. Governors are required to visit each Club in the Division and attend a Board Meeting in person or by zoom. The Governor or Lt Governor should be the guest of the club.
- * The Lt. Governor and his/her spouse/escort should be invited to attend and participate in special activities of every club in the division as a guest of the club. (installation of officers, fundraisers, service projects)

Object 6: To cooperate in creating and maintaining that sound public opinion and high idealism which make possible the increase of righteousness, justice, patriotism and good will.
