
or what they represented, such as Minecraft characters and other more popular video characters. Over 400 children paraded around the track throughout the evening.

The next event took place a week later. This time the parade was through Central Park, our local city park downtown. There numerous groups were stationed around the sidewalk that meanders through the park.



TRANSYLVANIA UNIVERSITY CIRCLE K


