Purpose for the KT District of Kiwanis This Year

ORIENTATION FOR NEW MEMBERS AND CLUB INTRODUCTION

Do you know what it really means to be a Kiwanian?

Expect to learn about the club's purpose, activities, and how you can get involved as a new member.

DOES YOUR CLUB HAVE MANY HELPING HANDS OR FEWER HANDS?

Keep current members from leaving by focusing on engaging them with meaningful activities and events. Regularly gather feedback to address their needs. Communicate clearly about club benefits and opportunities, and foster a sense of belonging through recognition, leadership development, and referral programs that encourage ongoing involvement.

IGNITE YOUR CLUB THROUGH SUCCESSFUL SLP'S!

A successful Student Leadership Program (SLP) in the KT District of Kiwanis relies on strong mentorship, clear goals aligned with the organization's mission, and engaging service projects that motivate students and foster teamwork. Providing opportunities for leadership development, maintaining open communication, and recognizing student achievements are key. Additionally, cultivating an inclusive environment and actively recruiting new members ensure the program's vibrancy and growth, benefiting both students and the broader community.

TAKING CARE OF OUR FUTURE WITH YOUNGER MEMBERS

To attract younger members to Kiwanis, offer service projects with clear impact, leadership opportunities, and mentorship. Use social media to highlight successes and events, involve youth in planning, and seek their feedback to keep the club relevant and welcoming.

PLANNING TO MAKE MONEY OR JUST NOISE?

To run a successful fundraiser in the KT District of Kiwanis, set clear goals that align with the club's mission and involve members early in planning. Create engaging activities, promote the event widely—especially through social media—and keep communication open. Gather feedback, adjust plans as needed, and recognize volunteers and donors to encourage future participation.

Mid-Year Breakout Sessions Overview

MEMBERSHIP ROUNDTABLE

(Friday and Saturday session scheduled)

The Membership Roundtable with Carol Wisdom focused on effective strategies for recruiting new members, retaining current ones, and fostering engagement through innovative activities and consistent communication within the club.

HUMAN TRAFFICKING

Human trafficking is a critical issue that affects communities worldwide, including those served by organizations like Kiwanis. Addressing this problem involves raising awareness, supporting prevention efforts, and partnering with local agencies to protect vulnerable individuals. By educating members and engaging in collaborative initiatives, clubs can contribute to combating human trafficking and making a meaningful difference in their communities.

RISK MANAGEMENT

Does your club have a potential problem?

(Friday and Saturday session scheduled)

Risk management was a key topic discussed with Charles Ridenour, who emphasized the importance of proactive strategies to safeguard club activities and ensure the safety of members and participants. By identifying potential risks early and developing clear guidelines, Charles encouraged clubs to create a culture of responsibility and preparedness. His insights highlighted the need for ongoing training and open communication to effectively minimize risks and maintain a secure environment for all.

PRESIDENTS' ROUNDTABLE

Are your goals attainable?

At the Presidents roundtable, Mark highlights the importance of collaboration, communication, and mutual support in club leadership. They urge attendees to apply best practices for engaging members, streamlining administration, and fostering an inclusive environment.
