CLYDE HIGH SCHOOL KEY CLUB WINTER FORMAL



CLUB HEARS ABOUT SAFE HAVEN BABY BOX

Shelley Drennan introduced Karen Light from Safe Haven Baby Box (SHBB). Safe Haven Baby Box is a safe location for a woman to surrender a baby 60 days or younger that she is no longer able to care for.

Per the Texas State Haven Law, babies 60 days or younger must be surrendered by a parent and handed directly to a hospital staff member, fireman or they may use the anonymous Baby Box. Abilene's Safe Baby Box is located at the Abilene Fire Department, Station 7, 431 N. Pioneer Dr, Abilene, TX 79603. The SHBB will immediately contact Dept. of Health & Human Services for a private adoption.

From 2017-2023, Texas led the US in newborn abandonments with 103. Visit SHBB.ORG for further information. A 24-Hour National Crisis Hotline, 1-866-99BABY1. The hotline has provided counseling for over 7,000 callers from all over the US. This service has led to over 125 babies surrendered at Safe Haven locations and 31 babies thus far surrendered in a Baby Box.
