DUES INCREASE

Diane Terrell, Club Treasurer, announced that the Board of Director's voted to implement the proposed dues increase that was approved by the Club Membership on <u>06-26-25</u> along with approval for the new Club Bylaws revision.

- ❖ Increase Associate/Educator/Spousal dues membership from \$11 to \$15 or (+\$4) / month,
- ❖ Increase Regular Membership dues from \$65 to \$70 or (+\$5) / month,
- ❖ Increase Senior Membership dues from \$25 to \$30 or (+\$5) / monthly,
- We do not propose in an increase in annual corporate membership of \$600/year currently.

Diane also asked members to pay their dues by enrolling in bill pay or pay by Venmo.

CLUB HEARS PROGRAM ABOUT ABILENE RADIO HISTORY

Tom McAlister introduced former Greater Abilene Kiwanian Bruce Campbell. Bruce spoke about several radio stations that were started in Abilene, including KRBC radio, KWKC and KMWX. These stations were pioneers in the radio industry. He also spoke about the Communications Act of 1934 that replaced the Federal Radio Commission with the new Federal Communications Commission.
