

More than 7,000 clubs in 79 nations and geographic areas



Kiwanis structure







Club business

Members vote to:

- Elect club officers and directors
- Amend club bylaws

Board of Directors:

- Determines club policies
- Approves club projects
- Approves and controls club's budget
- Approves membership applications
- Manages the club



Board of Directors meeting



- First Tuesday of the month which may change based on major holidays.
- All members are welcome to attend
- Only elected board members and officers can vote.

Finance & budget



Administrative account

- Income from club dues, meal charges, new member fees
- For administrative expenses of club

Service (Project) account

- Income from public fundraising projects or contributions
- Cannot be used to pay club administrative expenses of the club



New member enrollment fee and Annual club dues

Club: \$125/quarter which covers the following dues.

- Kiwanis International: \$58.00
- District Dues: \$ 26.00
- Magazine subscription- \$8.00
- Liability Insurance- \$18.00
- Liability Insurance for officers and board- \$4.00

All of these annual expenses are paid directly by the club for each member in October/November each year by Treasurer.

Club secretary sends the statement, and club Treasurer collects the payments.


The Eliminate Project
