Meals are \$8 per person and can be pre-paid on an annual basis.

The guest speaker's meals are paid by the club. Members bringing a guest are will pay for the guest's meal.

During the regular meeting we ask for happy/sad dollars. Members donate a dollar if they had something good or bad happen to them during the preceding week. The collection box is opened at the end of the year and the club decides what to do with the collected money. Donations are entirely voluntary.

It is understood that not every member can attend every meeting but we hope you will attempt to attend as many meetings as possible.
