












A Doernbecher challenge for our members... It looks like this year we will be unable to sponsor a Salmon BBQ to raise money for the Kiwanis Doernbecher Children's Cancer Program. However, that doesn't mean that we must give up on our dream of sending a nice donation off to the KDCCP project. In the last few years, we've managed to donate anywhere from \$3,000 to \$5,000 after having completed our Salmon BBQ fundraiser. It is possible that we could contribute \$2000 - \$2500 this year! Here's how we might manage to do that! 1) Our Board budgeted a donation of \$1200 and that amount is already in the service account, having been raised either through the donation jar we periodically pass around at our meetings, or through other fundraising efforts. 2) The Key Club just raised \$340 at their Bake Sale, which has already been deposited into the Kiwanis account and marked under the KDCCP line item. 3) Our members are used to generously donating for the purchase of tickets, raffle items and prizes, food and more for the Salmon BBQ. What if members who feel comfortable doing so, choose to just directly donate the funds they would normally spend on the Salmon BBQ into the Kiwanis account in the name of the KDCCP cause? Anyone who wishes to do this may bring a check (with KDCCP written in the memo), to the July 16th meeting. If you can't make that meeting, but wish to donate to the cause, please contact Chris or George. Please don't feel obligated to do this. There are no expectations... we are just

providing an avenue for members who wish to support the cause to be able to do so!

- The amount slowly accumulates, but members have already fundraised \$160 for the club by working at the Hillsboro Tuesday Night Market. Next week we have 3 members signed up, which will bring in another \$96.
