OLYMPIA KIWANIS FOUNDATION BOARD MINUTES APRIL 25, 2024 Submitted by Charles Pailthorp, Secretary

Board Attendance, proxies, and guests: unchanged from Club meeting Called to Order: Shawn opened the Foundation meeting at 12:22.

- 1. MINUTES: The minutes for the board meeting of March 2024 were approved by email on April 17, 2024.
- 2. FINANCIAL: Review and Approval of Foundation Financial Reports as of March 31st, 2024: Nicole. Moved and seconded by Kathy and Derek V for approval, which was given without dissent.
- Nicole highlighted that there has been additional funding added to CFK line.
- Sustainable funding within the Foundation resources: Shawn, Matt

Matt noted that we need to anticipate possible reductions in Foundation funding for community service projects.. Shawn we've always been nearly even. Shawn has sent a 5 year history of Foundation funding to Dennis Pulsipher for his analysis and suggestions..

Shawn proposes that the Board meet in person on August 2nd to review committee budget proposals and how we should address the need to set priorities and find strategies for increased funding.

Derek asked if committee chairs should be included; Shawn thought that would complicate the discussion without added advantages since we will have budget proposals from the committees.

Derek moved and Charles seconded that we meet on Aug 2, mid-day, time TBD, to discuss priorities for funding in the future, both Foundation and Club. Shawn noted that direct contributions go to the Foundation budget, while sales revenues have gone to the Club. We need a planning chair, fund-raising chair, and other designation of responsibilities. All this will be fine-tuned. The motion was approved without dissent.

3. OPEN FLOOR:

- Matt: a partnership with Olympia Rotary on the Olympia Spaghetti Bowl 2024 needs discussion. In the past, this event has provided some funding for Foundation scholarships. Shawn noted we have not had good experience in collaborating with Rotary. Matt will talk further with Rotary and see what develops.
- Karen: Do we have a date for our annual New Officers dinner, which has been
 in Sepember. Shawn recalled that this year, lack of interest led to cancellation.
 Nothing has been planned at this point.
- Shawn moved and Derek seconded that on Saturday, June 1st, 10 am to 2 pm, we have a fundraiser: Garden plant sales at West Side Garden. Approved without dissent.
- Derek noted that interest and applications for Youth Law Service Camp has developed as hoped. Saturday, Aug 17th, will be the graduation event. Derek will keep us posted.

Olympia Kiwanis Foundation Scholarship

Robert "Bob" Bigelow 1927 - 2005



Robert Bigelow was a member of the Waterfront Kiwanis for many years. He was an active volunteer and leader for the March of Dimes *Walk America* annual fundraiser.

A partner in the ownership of *Bigelow's Office Supplies*, Robert "Bob" Bigelow and his wife Betty worked tirelessly for the children of Olympia and Thurston County. Bob was a positive and vocal advocate to allow women into Kiwanis, which occurred in 1987.

A former U. S Marine during World War II, Bob was a patriot and a leader who worked throughout his life to change the world, one child and one community at a time. Bigelow, who served in World War II, was wounded when he and fellow Marines landed on Iwo Jima. He was 17. He also served on the Salvation Army Board of Directors, and could be found every December ringing the bell and the Christmas kettles. Bigelow was named a Living Legend of Thurston County by Big Brothers, Big Sisters in 2002. He spent 60 years as a volunteer for the March of Dimes, served 18 years on the Thurston County Civil Service Board and served on the boards or as a volunteer for the YMCA, YWCA, Thurston County Fair, Friendship Board, the American Legion, Veterans of Foreign Wars and Senior Services for South Sound.

Bob had a great sense of humor, and always had an appropriate "story" for every situation.

One day, while at Kamp Kiwanis undergoing Lieutenant Governor training, Bob woke up and announced he had a "dream". He dreamt that at the Capital City Lakefair celebration and parade this year, there would be a Kiwanis "float" display, representing the 8 Kiwanis Clubs in Thurston County. Bob took his dream back to the local Kiwanis clubs, and made it a reality. Members from each Kiwanis Club walked beside a trailer with a "Kiwanis" sandwich board handing out balloons along the route to children with lists of the Kiwanis Clubs and their community contributions from the previous year.



AP03.15 Satellite Clubs (continued)


- Grilling activities shall be reported to the President when the need to accept such activities would be required prior to a meeting of the Board of Directors, and such reporting shall be brought to the Executive Committee for approval of the activity if it occurs prior to a meeting of the Board of Directors.
- There is no minimum membership required in the Waterfront satellite. If the satellite attains the required number of members to become chartered as an official Kiwanis club, they can follow new club organizational procedures to elect officers, adopt club bylaws and petition Kiwanis International to be recognized as a Kiwanis club.
- Members of Waterfront are members of the Olympia Kiwanis Club and have all the rights, privileges, and responsibilities of membership.
- Members of Waterfront pay dues as Club members. OKC pays appropriate dues and fees to Kiwanis International and the District.
- Olympia Kiwanis Club (OKC) Support will include:
- ☐ Ensure satellite members receive proper orientation, support and continued education.
- ☐ Maintain all records and bank accounts for Waterfront. At the request of the satellite, monies raised by and distributed by Waterfront may be accounted for separately. All bills, payments, deposits, etc. need to be approved by the OKC Board of Directors.
- ☐ Encourage satellite members to participate in host club and District activities.
- ☐ Help develop a membership retention and growth plan
- ☐ Support satellite activities.
- ☐ Process all membership applications.

We spent the last month arranging the greenhouse, planting shallots/leeks/chives in the West Side South Field, and pickling cucumbers in the West Side East Central Field.

We hosted Black Hills FFA and Avanti H.S. Urban Agriculture Class at the West Side and Capitol Gardens, weeding garlic, mounding potatoes, and planting flowers. We want to welcome some new volunteers this week and shout out to our fantastic farm intern and seasonal workers, Sonny and Percy, who helped in numerous ways to keep our production on track!

In May we started installing our bean trellis infrastructure at the West Side location.

If you have an hour Wednesday and Thursday morning to come by the designated farm site for each day, we could use all hands on deck to start weeding maintenance; every hour weeding we put in will save us tenfold.
