Happy February everyone! As part of the Membership Growth and Education Committee, I wanted to bring your attention to this effective team and its current goals. The Committee's primary purpose is to recruit people to join us in making our community better for kids. It also seeks to educate existing members about the Club and to retain them Our Club currently has 97 members.



After the last fiscal year ended in September, our numbers dropped by about 10 percent. We are taking several actions to reverse this trend. We are continuing the Board's efforts to reach out to lapsed members by making individual phone calls and texts to them. If we are going to reach our goal of getting 10 new members by the end of September 2025 we need everyone's help.

Olympia Kiwanis Foundation Scholarships

Clifford "Kip" Stilz Jr. 1944-2008

Clifford "Kip" Stilz Jr. was the Olympia Kiwanis Club President in 1985-1986. He served as a Thurston County District Judge and was the Presiding Judge for 23 years. He helped start Drug Court and was the head of the Thurston County Mental Health Court.

Kip was a leader in obtaining the *Women's Olympic Marathon Trials of* 1984 here in Olympia. He enjoyed working a water stop for runners for the Capital City Marathon for many years. A *Capitalarian* from 1993 until his death in 2008, Judge Stilz supported the community LAKEFAIR celebration and worked many shifts selling Olympia Kiwanis' famous *Roast Beef Sandwiches*. Kip was a strong advocate to allow women into Kiwanis and sponsored the first woman in 1986. He worked many hours at the club's west side food bank garden. Judge Stilz helped to organize an evening high school *Leadership Training Program* each year for interested youth.

Judge Stilz was born in Olympia and attended Olympia High School. He clerked for state Supreme Court Justice Robert Finley before joining *Fristoe, Taylor and Schultz* where he practiced law for 13 years. In 1985, he was elected to the Thurston County District Court, and served as presiding judge for 23 years, including being the head of the Thurston County Mental Health Court. He served on the Judicial Information System Committee and the Washington Bar Association Press Committee. He was instrumental in the implementation of "Drug Court", to help find solutions that would assist repeat offenders break the cycle of criminal activity.

AP18: REQUESTS FOR AID FROM INDIVIDUALS

• All requests for financial aid or service project volunteer hours shall be submitted in advance, in writing to the President or a Club Officer for consideration by the Board of Directors.

• Each request will be individually considered on its own merit and any expenditure of funds not part of the annual Budget must be approved by the Board.

• Generally, the Club does not fund individual requests for personal subsidies of travel trips, conferences or training events that are not Kiwanis related (i.e. not Key Club or Circle K etc.)

AP19: MEAL GUESTS

AP19.01: Program Speakers: Speaker(s) meals are paid by the Club. Speaker's guests and the Club member introducing the program pay their own way.

AP19.02: Member Guests: Club member pays for themselves and their guests.

AP19.03: Achieving By Believing Program: The student(s) receiving the award and their parent(s) or two family members total are Club guests. Siblings or additional (beyond two) relatives and nominating teacher(s) pay their own meals.

AP19.04: Law Enforcement Officer of the Year: The Award winner and their spouse or partner are Club guests. The Commanding Officer, parents or other family members pay for their own meals.

AP19.05: Visiting Kiwanis Dignitaries: When an Kiwanis Officer is on official business or presenting/receiving an award, they are Club guests. Their spouse or partner and Interclub participating officers pay their own meals.
