Membership Contest

A second Membership Contest has been approved by the Missouri-Arkansas District Board of Directors, to start Oct. 1 and continue until March 31, 2022. The district completed its first contest earlier this year.

All clubs in the district are eligible to compete in one of two divisions, depending on their official membership total on Oct. 1. Group A will be for clubs with 30 or more members; Group B will be for clubs with fewer than 30.

The district board, meeting via Zoom on Sept. 28, approved the use of \$15,000 to be distributed as grants to clubs that have the largest percentage of membership increase between Oct. 1 and next March 31.

Grants would be awarded as follows to Group A winners: first place, \$3,000; second, \$2,000; third, \$1,000; and fourth, two awards of \$500 each.

The Group B winning grants would be the same, except that four grants of \$500 each would be awarded for fourth place.

As of Aug. 31, the district had 45 clubs with 30 or more members, and 119 with fewer than 30, which is why more grants will be awarded in Group B. Grant winners would be determined as those clubs with the greatest percentage increase in membership, according to the official KI Membership Report as of April 1, 2021. In case of ties the money for a certain place will be split evenly.

These grants could be used only for service projects, community improvement projects and new educational scholarships, not for general and administrative purposes. Dues for members added during the contest period must be paid before a grant check will be written, and an accounting will be required in writing within 60 days of receipt of a grant.

MO-ARK Governor Carla O'Brien said, "We have a strategic plan for membership for the year: to grow our Hands For Service by at least 500 members, please do your utmost to be a partner in achieving that goal to rebuild and reenergize all of our clubs!"

Nominations are open for the Distinguished Club awards. Please download the form here: distinguished club

Get credit where credit is due and nominate your club for an award. If you club met these criteria you are eligible to get recognized at the Mid-Year Education Day and District convention. You are using your Kiwanis Superpowers!!

Membership Growth in Existing Clubs: The club must have a net increase in membership. The invoice you pay to Kiwanis for Oct. 2021 must contain two or more members than the invoice you paid for 2020.

Committee Chairs: The club must have appointed a Membership and Public Relation Chairs. Must have at least five of the following:

New Club Growth Initiative: Did you sponsor or co-sponsor a new Kiwanis Club or a new Service Leadership Program?

Leadership Education: Did both the club's President and Secretary attend Club Leadership Education either in person or online before September 30th of the year in which they were elected? (2020)

Conference Attendance: Was the club represented by a member at one of the following: the Mid-Year Education Day, District Convention, or the International Convention and at least one Division or Regional meeting?

Local Community Service: Did the club provide service projects or programs for the children of the community?

Global Community Service: Did the club support the Eliminate Project or the Kiwanis International Children's Fund?

Service Leadership Programs: Did the club sponsor a Service Leadership Program or contribute to the Districts Outreach Fund, AND contribute to at least one of the following: The Earl Collins Foundation, Foundation for Kamp Kiwanis, or Key Leader.

Nomination forms are due by November 30, 2021 for consideration of the award.

Youth Protection and Background Checks



More than 300,000 youth participate in Kiwanis Service Leadership Programs and millions of youth around the world come in contact with Kiwanians through service projects. It is imperative that Kiwanians are not only cleared to work with children, but that they are trained with confidence in the safe practices our group provides.

Updated policies and procedures are now available on the <u>Kiwanis Youth Protection website</u>. All members should have access to the document and read the policies annually. Please pay close attention to all the policies, for there are many new changes to the updated procedures. All SLP advisors and chaperones, who chaperone an overnight or single day off school premises, must complete and pass the Kiwanis approved Background Check by Safe Hiring Solutions.

Although it is not required of non-SLP groups to have members use the background check, many clubs have taken advantage of this opportunity to be prepared. It is strongly encouraged that all members (SLP related or not) have on file a cleared background check from within the last 10 years. Whether if your club gets background checks from the state or from the local police department, you should have up to date documentation that you were cleared to work with children during your time in Kiwanis. You are not covered by our risk management insurance unless you have an active Kiwanian background check on file. The training provided by Praesidium is a nice overview of what to look for when it comes to identifying situations in which you will need to report. Please take advantage of the training courses. They are easy to follow, informative, and free!


