12 members, and two guests present: today's speaker, John Kellogg, a longtime volunteer of Greater St Louis Honor Flight, and Linda Kuchar, Connie's sister-in-law, a possible new member. Louann opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance and Pauline followed with the invocation. Bill spoke about how nice the Christmas Dinner turned out and everyone attending enjoyed the delicious food. Thanks again to all who helped plan this event.

John Kellogg was brought up as a Navy brat and he personally served 26 years in the Navy. He then worked for McDonald Douglas and thereafter Boeing until retiring in 2011. He wanted to stay part of the service scene and therefore has since volunteered for the Honor Flight. Earl Morris was the original founder of the Honor Flight. Earl was a pilot and started the flights with six airplanes and several fellow pilots in 2006. Since then, a total of 2560 veterans have been flown from St. Louis to Washington, DC to see their memorials and this year will represent the 100th flight. There are four flights out of St Louis each year. Veterans are picked to go in the following order: WWII, Korean and then Vietnam war. Also, those veterans who are in poor health and age are considered first picks. Each veteran has an assigned guardian for the trip. This guardian is responsible for all assistance needed. Guardians must be FFF, fast, fit and furious, able to push a wheelchair for 5 miles and lift at least 100 lbs. The trip to Washington is free for the Veteran but each guardian must contribute \$550.00 to have the honor of assisting a veteran. Flights leave at 6:00 AM via Southwest Airlines and return the same day at approximately 8:00 PM. Upon arriving at Baltimore International Airport, the veterans are transported via motorcoach. They are given a tour of all the military monuments including the tomb of the Unknown Soldier. It's a very emotional trip as thankful cheering Americans line the pathway to the different locations. Some of the locations have school children handing out cards of gratitude. Group and individual photos are taken throughout the day. These photos are developed and then sent out to the veterans at a later date. Upon returning home and descending the plane, flags line the airport as a tribute to their sacrifices. Thanks to John and others like himself, this is a wonderful thank you to our Veterans.
