\$2,000 Grant Money from Membership Contest

Members at the May 4, 2022 meeting voted to fund three programs—MRH Weekend on Wheels food program (\$500), Ryan Hummert Memorial Scholarship for an MRH senior (\$100), and the Beatrice Johnson Kiwanis Youth Kamp (\$500) to help fund the construction of a much needed building to extend the length of time the camp is usable for students. Governor Carla O'Brien has been invited to give a program to the club on the camp. At that time, we plan to surprise her with a \$500 check for the camp which is her signature project during her term.

At the May 25th meeting, members voted on nine agencies to receive the remaining \$900. Each agency will receive a \$100 donation to further their cause. The club also voted to spend another \$100 of club money for a 10th organization since members had suggested ten organizations worthy of receiving help. The organizations receiving donations are the following: Special Olympics; Gateway 180; Nurses for Newborns; Camp Wyman; Circle of Concern; Carpenter's Kids Camp; Sherwood Forest Camp; 2nd Wind Lung Transplant; Joe's Place, and Ukraine refugee relief.

Representatives from these organizations will be asked to come to a meeting so that checks can be presented personally and so the club can learn even more about what they do for children and the community.

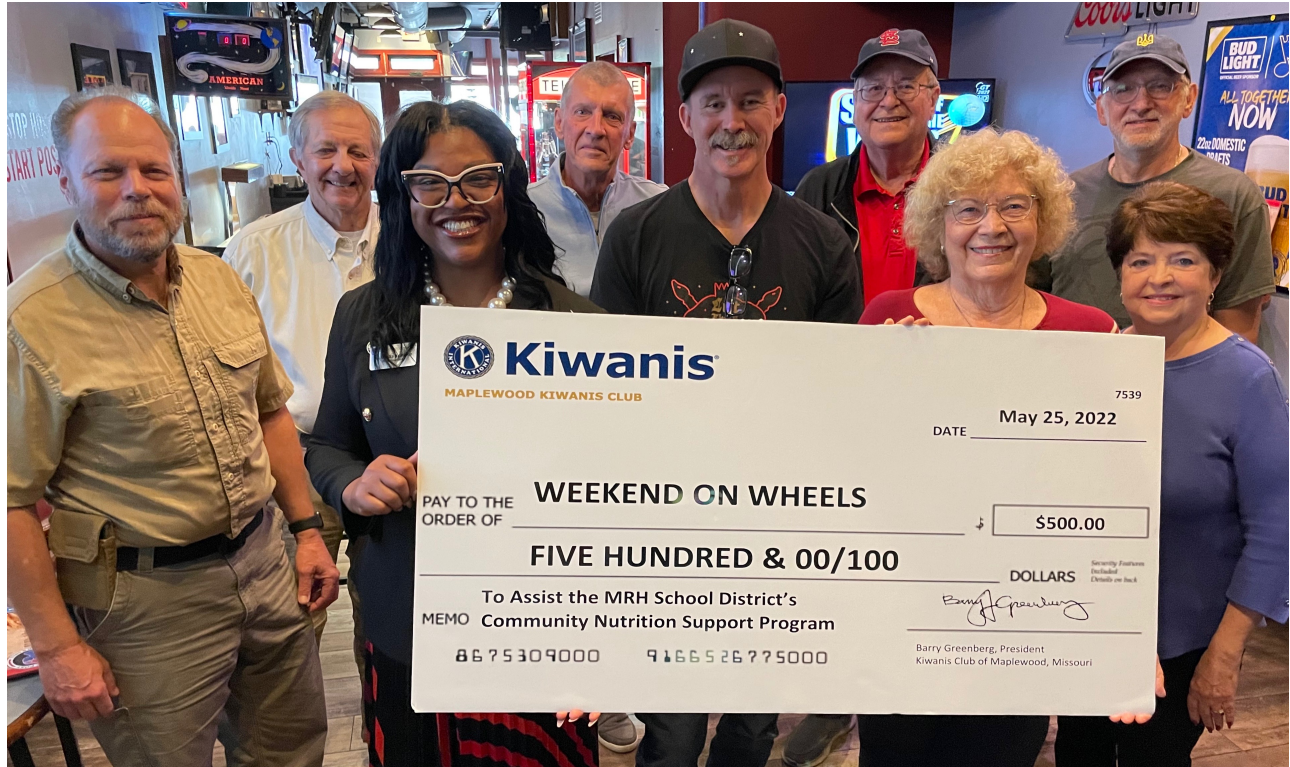

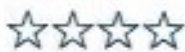
