### **Kiwanis Corner**

Key Club International is Kiwanis' oldest and largest continuing youth-service program. The first Key Club ("for key boys") was organized by the Kiwanis Club of Sacramento, California in 1925. The concept of a service club for high school (or secondary students ages 14-18) spread to other Kiwanis clubs, and Key Club became an official program of Kiwanis International in 1942. Key Club International is run largely by its members, who conduct conventions and elect officers each year at the district and international levels.
