## **Springfield Daily Citizen**

Steve Pokin, a reporter with the Springfield Daily Citizen, spoke to the club about this local online newspaper at the December 7 club meeting. Mr. Pokin is a former reporter for the Springfield News Leader newspaper. He still writes his popular "Pokin Around" and "The Answer Man" columns, but for the Daily Citizen now.

The newspaper is a non-proforganization, despite being behind a pay-wall for subscribers only. They are currently funded by a combination of subscription fees and funding provided by major donors but they hope to be able to operate on subscription fees only within the next 3 years, especially since they have recently rolled out a smart-phone application for both Apple and Android phones. Mr. Pokin said the newspaper has been

well received locally, with 2000 paid subscribers so far. He said the online newspaper is so successful that they have recently had to add staff and are now near the staff size of the News Leader, though the Daily Citizen still doesn't have a sports writer.

Mr. Pokin emphasized that the Springfield Daily Citizen is a very locally focused newspaper. The board of directors is composed of local people, decision making is handled locally, and the reporters are all members of the community and cover news of local interest. He said the online format is the way that most newspapers will be adopting in the near future, and expressed his opinion that print newspapers won't last more than 10 years except for very large, well know operations like the New York Times.
