LEARNING AND LIVING LEADERSHIP OUT LOUD

Everyone can identify a great leader. But what makes a leader great? It takes education and training. Kiwanis International is training the next set of great community leaders through **Kiwanis Amplify**, a new online leadership development program for those who want to amplify their team-leadership skills.

Participants learn how to improve more than their Kiwanis club. They gain skills to improve careers, communities, schools and the lives of adults and children everywhere. More than 1,100 Kiwanians from 41 districts on five continents have participated in Kiwanis Amplify.

"I've had the opportunity for leadership training with companies like American Express, Hilton Hotels and Disney," said Kelly Pena, a Kiwanis Amplify graduate from the California-Nevada-Hawaii District. "And I will tell you that Kiwanis Amplify rates up there with these top companies' leadership programs."

More than 85% of those who responded to the post-program survey said they learned at least one new thing from every module. "This program has given us the opportunity to invest in our own club members in providing leadership knowledge and training," said Jean Long Manteufel, another graduate from the Wisconsin-Upper Michigan District. "And it is awesome."

Kiwanis Amplify is conducted online. Participants can complete their assignments at a time that's convenient for them. Eight leadership topics are covered in the course:

- The qualities of a good leader.
- Methods of communication.
- Planning engaging events.
- Promoting diversity, equity and inclusion throughout a team.
- Working with others.
- Sharing a message.
- Strategic planning.
- Self-care.

The participation fee is US\$50 for members of Kiwanis International. The fee is \$600 for non-members.

Important Missouri Arkansas News

Attention All Presidents and Secretaries FORM 990N DUE FEBRUARY 15

IRS regulations require that tax exempt clubs file their annual income tax returns in the fifth month after the end of their fiscal year. For most Kiwanis clubs with an October 1-September 30 fiscal year, returns are due February 15 of each year.

In most cases, the filing is informational. You advise the IRS that your club is still active, and provide names and contact information of officers and directors.

Similar reports are required to the Secretary of State's office in your state. In Missouri you can file in 2-yr intervals electronically. In Arkansas, annual filings are required. (State reports are due in August.)

If you fail to make these filings, the IRS can revoke your tax exempt status. Secretary of State's office can cancel your incorporation. Then you must file paperwork and pay fees to get them reinstated. They send post card reminders when your filings are due, but be careful to keep your mailing address up to date to receive the reminders.

Kiwanis Club of Gravette Promotes Children's Literacy

The Kiwanis Club of Gravette, AR is pleased to announce that they have been awarded a \$500 microgrant from the Kiwanis Children's Fund For a project to benefit the Sulphur Springs Public Library. Sulphur Springs is a small rural town of 481 residents, and 33% of the population are children under age 8. This area has no public transportation and many of the children receive free or reduced-price meals at school. The public library had been closed for several years and was reopened 1 year ago in an older historic WPA building built in 1942 which served as a school in the past.

The Gravette Kiwanis Club built a large bookcase and donated over 120 children's books for the library using funds from the microgrant and from our annual pancake breakfast ticket sales. The library hosted a summer reading program and served 30 children the first summer they were open, and they also host a weekly children's story time. Our Kiwanis Club also donated a large rug so the children would have a place to be seated for story time.

Kiwanis Club of eCentennial Donates Proceeds to Convoy of Hope


