Care to Learn Helps with the Three "H"s

Our guest speaker at the Feb. 22 club meeting was Andrea Harp, a member of the Marketing and Communications team at Care to Learn. Care to Learn partners with schools and area non-profits to provide immediate relief for health, hunger, and hygiene needs of students in Missouri schools, allowing them to focus on learning. Care to Learn currently has 40 chapters working with school districts throughout Missouri.

Health, Hunger, and Hygiene are the 3 "H"s the organization focuses on. Care to Learn works with teachers to identify students who have unmet needs and provide immediate relief in a confidential manner that preserves the students' dignity.

Health issues can include such things as eyeglasses, emergency dental surgery, transportation to medical appointments, and even treat-

ing for bedbugs in the home. They are also developing programs to provide mental health treatment.

Hunger is the biggest part of Care to Learn's work. By partnering with churches and local community organizations has helped 30,000 students with food insecurity and served 3 million meals since 2018. They provide students with vouchers to purchase fresh produce, as well as supplies for school food pantries and snacks for classrooms to help students get through the day.

Hygiene includes traditional and feminine hygiene products, which students can request confidentially through the school nurse. Care to Learn also supports school clothes closets in all Springfield Public Schools, and provides vouchers to laundromats so students can have clean clothes to wear to school.

Care to Learn knows that simple things like these can often stand between a child and their ability to learn. By partnering with schools and community organizations they can meet these needs immediately and discreetly, giving all students a chance for a better future.
