

Biography of Judge Victor Head

Judge Victor Head has devoted his life to public service, the law, and his community. A native of the Mississippi Delta, he graduated from **Leland High School in Leland, Mississippi, in 1966** before attending **Millsaps College in Jackson, Mississippi, and Mississippi State University in Starkville, Mississippi,** where he studied from 1966 to 1970.

Following college, Judge Head worked in the accounting department of **International Paper Company in Natchez, Mississippi,** from 1970 to 1974. In 1972, he married **Rebecca Davis** in Delhi, Louisiana, beginning a partnership that would span decades. Their daughter, **Jennifer,** was born in 1974, and their son, **Nathaniel,** was born in 1980.

Determined to pursue a career in law, Judge Head attended the **University of Mississippi School of Law (Ole Miss),** earning his **Juris Doctor** between 1974 and 1977. He later served his country in the **Judge Advocate General (JAG) Office of the United States Air Force** from 1980 to 1984, where he gained valuable legal and leadership experience.

After completing his military service, Judge Head joined the law firm of **Garrett and Woods in Monett, Missouri,** practicing both civil and criminal law from 1984 to 1989. His commitment to justice and public service led to his appointment as **District Defender for Missouri's 39th Judicial Circuit,** a position he held from 1989 to 2006. In 2006, he became **Associate Circuit Judge for Barry County, Missouri,** serving the citizens of the county from its seat in Cassville until 2014. He then continued his judicial service as a **Senior Judge,** serving from 2014 through 2026.

A significant chapter in Judge Head's life began in 1972 when his parents relocated from the Mississippi Delta to the Missouri Ozarks after purchasing a youth camp overlooking **Shoal Creek,** approximately ten miles from Monett. They named the camp **Camp Soaring Hawk** and operated it as a Christian youth camp for nearly twenty years. During its early years, many young people benefited from its ministry and outreach. Today, the camp is known as **Camp Barnabas,** a nationally recognized organization serving children and adults with illnesses and disabilities. Judge Head remains deeply appreciative of the camp's mission and encourages others to learn more about the life-changing work it continues to perform.

Throughout his distinguished career—as an accountant, Air Force JAG officer, attorney, public defender, associate circuit judge, and senior judge—**Victor Head** has been guided by a steadfast commitment to fairness, integrity, faith, and service. His lifelong dedication to the law and to helping others has left a lasting impact on the communities of Southwest Missouri and beyond.
