Lt. Governor Listermann's 2025-26 Vision

As the Kiwanis year begins, I'm excited to share some thoughts with you. My vision for 2025-26 is summed up in the word FUNNER.



We need to be **FUNNER**.

However, since "fun" means different things to different people, I'll provide a bit of context. Each letter of the word FUNNER signifies characteristics to be demonstrated in all of us. Fun is often confused with entertainment. That's not the fun I'm referring to.

- **F** Friendly...We're not just cordial and professional, we're sincerely kind and enjoy one another's company. This doesn't mean we won't have conflicts. It means we're willing to enter the danger and engage in difficult conversations. Returning emails and phone calls applies here. If we're not talking, we're not communicating.
- **U** Undaunted...We sense needs and take action. We don't let naysayers easily discourage us. We have a mission to complete and complete it we will. We're not afraid to take risks and try new things, yet we shouldn't infringe on another person's sense of belonging. This requires implementing new ways of working. We'll learn these together. Preparation is required on our part and the resulting engagement is worth the effort. Just showing up is not enough. And turning every gathering into a business meeting is pure torture for us and the participants.
- **N** Negotiating...We embody the desire and ability to mediate, understanding ideas are just ideas, and all ideas are beneficial. We'll navigate conflicts by focusing efforts on the problems to solve rather than personalities and factions. We're all Kiwanians first and foremost, yet serving different functional roles remain part of our organizational structures. Consequently, our rapidly changing

world requires a more adaptive and responsive approach. A position of Good Intent as opposed to our titles and past experiences is a good place to start. We should abstain from preconceived notions and reject the "we've never done it that way before" thinking.

N - Networkers...Without being salesy, we build authentic relationships based on mutual trust, not predictive trust, but trust where someone can say things like, "I have this position and I need help" or "I don't know what I'm doing, can you show me what to do." Most problems in organizations start when we assume people know what we know. Worse yet, when we assume they're too busy to learn, so we exclude them from conversations. Our efforts are invitational and we expect people to participate.

E - Elevating...We need to lift the spirits of people and the impacts of our work to encourage others towards love and good deeds. It's about reducing the WEIGHT and GRAVITY of BUREAUCRACY to give LIFT to HUMAN ENERGY while overcoming the DRAG of FEAR and producing the THRUST of PURPOSE. Always with a POSITIVE ATTITUDE. This is what happens when you LEAD with JOY. Thanks to Richard Sheridan and his book *Chief Joy Officer*. We are the competition, individually and collectively. Mo-Ark Division 4 is best when we challenge ourselves to raise the bar, rather than comparing ourselves with others. Let's continue to elevate one another and our division by leading with joy.

R - Results...We need to focus on results. Anyone can talk, but actions speak louder than words. We're looking for real and lasting impact and we shouldn't be so concerned about who sows and who reaps. It's amazing what we can do when we don't care who gets the credit. We must embody trust and open communication leading to greater commit to our plans while holding one another accountable. Otherwise, metrics and measurements don't matter. To get results, we need every component of FUNNER.

I can't begin to tell you how great Mo-Ark Division 4's performance will be in 2025-26, but I know we'll amaze ourselves time and time again. Let's do FUNNER things together!

Distinguished Criteria

Once you've completed your annual training and referenced your checklist, the next step is to familiarize yourself with the 2025-26 Distinguished Criteria. I like to use this criteria as a gauge for what a club or division is doing. If we're doing something that's not on the Distinguished Criteria, we should ask, "why are we doing it?" Many find they're doing things because they think it's expected when it was merely a previous officer's preference or the club always did it that way. We must examine everything we're doing and the Distinguished Criteria is a great place to start. If we're not doing the things on the Distinguished Criteria we should ask, why aren't we doing them?
