



Club Grant Program



Club Grant Program

The purpose of the Club Grant program is to help clubs address an unmet need that affects children in their community (or elsewhere) by supporting a project that provides long-term benefits that can be

sustained by the club.





1. Be Kiwanis-led. This means <u>at least 50%</u> of the work must be performed by Kiwanians or Kiwanis family members.





- 2. Fill a need within your community. Determine that need by completing a **community needs assessment**.
 - An assessment identifies needs that are currently unmet.
 - It also proves that your club's work will be relevant and necessary.



- 3. Include programming that recurs at least once per year.
 - Examples include, but are not limited to:
 - Hunger relief initiatives
 - Community gardens
 - Free libraries
 - •School supply and clothing events
 - •Leadership develop programs
 - Health clinics
 - •Literacy programs



- 4. Support activities within <u>at least one</u> Kiwanis cause area:
 - 1. Health and Nutrition
 - 2. Education and Literacy
 - 3. Youth Leadership Development



- 5. At least 25% of total funding must come from the club.
 - This can come from individual donations, fundraisers, the club's bank account or a club's foundation.



6. Must require <u>no more that 40% of total</u> funding from the Children's Fund.





- 7. Have at least <u>one non-Kiwanis funding partner</u> that provides funding to your project such as
 - The funding partner(s) can be a local church, school, NGO (nonprofit organization), or other community organization.
 - Additional partners can also take on a variety of roles like provide in-kind donations (such as supplies, storage space or volunteer hours).



8. Spend the grant money within 12 months of when the grant was awarded.



- Operating expenses or salaries of established programs and institutions.
- One-time events, sponsorships, scholarships or fellowships.
- Scientific research of medical studies.
- Capital construction projects or land/building purchase.

Letter of Inquiry



The Letter of Inquiry (LOI) provides the Children's Fund with an overview of your club's project.


You will be asked questions about:

- Project Overview
- Timeline
- Budget
- Community Needs Overview



Letter of Inquiry (LOI)

All LOIs must be submitted electronically using our grant system, Foundant.





Letter of Inquiry (LOI)



- After reviewing the LOI, a Children's Fund staff member will schedule a phone call or meeting over zoom.
- This discussion helps our staff determine whether the project meets eligibility requirements and is a good fit for funding.
- Club will be notified of the LOI decision within two weeks.



Grant Application



- An approved LOI will be invited to complete a full grant application.
- Grant application questions:
 - Partnerships
 - Sustainability
 - Member engagement and recruitment
 - Kiwanis visibility
 - Project goals



Grant Application



- Submitted applications will be reviewed by Children's Fund staff and Grants Committee who will make a funding recommendation to the board.
- Clubs will be notified on or before the publicized decision date.
- Grant payment will be made once all required documents have been submitted (i.e., signed grant agreement, IRS Form W-9, bank information, etc.).

Upcoming Grant Cycles

You can submit a Letter of Inquiry at any time during the year; however, only submissions received by the LOI due date will be considered for the corresponding funding cycle.

Funding decision	Letter of Inquiry due	Full application due
March 2023	1 November 2022	1 January 2023
August 2023	1 April 2023	1 June 2023



New Micro Grants Program

- If your club has 35 members or fewer and is in good standing with Kiwanis International and the Kiwanis Children's Fund, you may qualify to apply for a micro grant of US\$250- 1,000!
 - Shorter Application Process
 - Less Funding required from other resources
 - Faster distribution of funds
- Requirements: Project must be a service project to enhance lives of young children and youth within one of the Kiwanis cause areas.

Applications open October 1, First Award dates begin December 2022
