Last Change of the clock? Not So Fast!

According to the Reuters News Agency, a push in the U.S. Congress to make daylight-saving time permanent, which was unanimously passed by the Senate earlier this year, has stalled in the House of Representatives, with a key lawmaker saying they have been unable to reach consensus.

In March, the Senate voted to put a stop next year to the twice-annual changing of clock, however the House is divided. If they don't act before Dec. 31 the issue will have to be re-introduced.
