Bill Finuacane thanked club members for their contributions to the Salvation Army's food pantry. Altogether, we have filled five Thanksgiving baskets this year. Bill reported that nearly 600 turkeys have been distributed to needy families; Let's Talk Turkey took in 306 birds to give away, and collected \$5135 to spend on groceries.

This Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, TD Ryan returns to the HY Vee parking lot to host Freezing for Food — an annual drive to fill our local pantries. All are invited to drop off nonperishable items.

Gary Vander Meer noted that some of us have signed up to ring the bell next weekend beside the red kettle at Schnuck's. He'll send out reminders early next week.

Jerry Wallstrom presented this year's Perfect Attendance awards. Many of our members have qualified year after year. Bill Finucane leads the club with the highest number of service hours, and Herb Buhr holds the record for the longest, uninterrupted stretch: 55 years.

PROGRAM

On the day before Thanksgiving, we expect smaller numbers, so we didn't host a guest speaker at lunch. Instead, Jim Barker, wearing a Jupiter shirt, quizzed several of our members about their favorite shows, movies, and so on — starting with himself.

Jim Barker enjoys many different sorts of cuisine, especially Mexican and Indian food. His favorite films include *The Godfather*, the Monty Python comedies, and — further back — *Arsenic and Old Lace*. He admits to watching *Gilligan's Island* every day after school as a youngster. His top musicians? Tom Waits and Radiohead. His celebrity dinner guests would be Abraham Lincoln and Francis Ford Coppola. Forced to choose between Shakespeare and the Three Stooges? Moe, Larry, and Curly. Jim spent some years as a very competitive dart player. He's also a big fan of cricket, and the Fortnite video game. Perhaps the most exotic trip Jim has taken was down to Miami in 2013, to see the Huskies compete in the Orange Bowl.

Caroline Collins also favors Indian and Mexican restaurants. She enjoys movies that make you think — such as *Eternal Sunshine of the Spotless Mind* — and sci-fi dramas: *Star Gate* and *Battlestar Galactica*. Favorite band? Bastille, from Great Britain.
