Matt Barrett's-Risk Management Corner

1. Scope of Kiwanis International's Liability Insurance

Kiwanis International's liability insurance is designed to protect clubs, members, and volunteers from legal liability that may arise while conducting approved Kiwanis activities. The policy provides protection for bodily injury, property damage, and personal injury that may occur during club events.

Who Is Covered?

- Kiwanis International and its affiliates, including Key Club, Circle K, and other sponsored youth programs.
- Kiwanis clubs and districts, including members, officers, and volunteers acting within the scope of their duties.
- Authorized participants in Kiwanis-sponsored activities.

What Activities Are Covered?

- Fundraisers and Service Projects: Events such as pancake breakfasts, car washes, charity auctions, and other typical Kiwanis service projects.
- Club Meetings and Social Gatherings: Standard club functions that are held in approved venues.
- Youth Programs and Activities: Key Club, Builders Club, and other youth programs, provided proper supervision and youth protection protocols are followed.

Types of Coverage Provided

- 1. General Liability Insurance:
 - o Protects against claims of bodily injury and property damage.
 - Provides coverage for medical expenses related to injuries that occur at club events.
- 2. Directors and Officers (D&O) Liability Insurance:
 - Protects club officers and directors from claims alleging mismanagement, negligence, or improper decision-making.
- 3. Crime Insurance:
 - Covers losses from theft, embezzlement, or fraud involving club funds.
- 4. Automobile Liability (Limited Scope):
 - Provides liability protection for non-owned and hired vehicles used for club activities.

 Does not cover physical damage to vehicles—members using personal vehicles should carry their own auto insurance.

2. Limitations and Exclusions of Kiwanis International's Insurance

While the Kiwanis International insurance policy offers broad coverage, it is important for clubs to understand certain exclusions and limitations:

- Non-Approved or High-Risk Activities: Events that fall outside of Kiwanis-approved activities or those deemed high-risk (e.g., skydiving, bungee jumping, or similar hazardous activities) may not be covered.
- Alcohol-Related Incidents: Events where alcohol is served may present an increased risk of liability, and specific guidelines must be followed to ensure coverage.
- Third-Party Vendors and Contractors: Kiwanis insurance may not extend to third-party vendors, requiring clubs to obtain proof of insurance from such providers.
- Non-Kiwanis Sponsored Events: Activities that are not directly organized or sanctioned by a Kiwanis club may not be covered.

3. When Additional Insurance May Be Required

In certain situations, Kiwanis International's liability insurance may not provide sufficient coverage, making it necessary for clubs to purchase additional insurance.

A. High-Risk Events or Activities

If a club is planning an event that involves inherently higher risks—such as athletic competitions, amusement rides, or water-related activities—it may be wise to secure specialized event insurance or additional liability coverage.

Examples:

- Fun runs or obstacle courses.
- Carnivals with mechanical rides or inflatables.
- Boating or swimming-related activities.

B. Events Serving Alcohol

When alcohol is served at a Kiwanis event, it introduces a higher degree of risk. While Kiwanis International's insurance may cover some aspects, clubs should consider purchasing liquor liability insurance to protect against claims arising from alcohol-related incidents.

Tip: Always review venue contracts thoroughly to identify insurance obligations.

C. Vendor Liability and Indemnification

When hiring third-party vendors (e.g., caterers, security services, or rental companies), clubs should ensure that the vendor carries its own insurance. Clubs should request a certificate of insurance and require that Kiwanis be listed as an additional insured.

D. Use of Motor Vehicles for Club Activities

While Kiwanis insurance offers limited non-owned auto liability coverage, it does not provide collision or comprehensive coverage for physical damage. If members or volunteers will be using their personal vehicles for club activities, they should verify that their auto insurance policy provides adequate coverage.

E. Large Public Events with Significant Attendance

For large-scale community events with a high volume of attendees, it is advisable to secure supplemental event liability insurance. This helps protect against claims that may exceed the limits of Kiwanis International's policy.

4. How to Obtain Additional Coverage

To obtain additional coverage, clubs can:

- Contact Kiwanis International's Insurance Provider: For advice on whether a specific event is covered and whether additional insurance is recommended.
- Work with a Local Insurance Agent: Clubs can secure additional event or liquor liability insurance through a reputable local insurance provider.
- Use Online Event Insurance Platforms: For quick, one-time event insurance, online platforms can provide quotes and policy

Conclusion: Protecting Clubs and Communities

Kiwanis International's liability insurance provides a strong foundation of protection for clubs and members. However, recognizing when additional coverage may be necessary is key to safeguarding the club's reputation and financial security. By staying informed and taking proactive measures, Kiwanis clubs in the New England District can continue to serve their communities with confidence and peace of mind.


