





Did you know that 1 in 5 girls and 1 in 13 boys experience abuse? This sad statistic spans worldwide, across all ages and socioeconomic levels, ethnicities, genders and within big and small communities. 89% of abusers are people that the children knows, loves and trusts. What's even worse, is that it is believed that 85% of child



Because of this, the Sheraden club held our Annual Youth Protection Training on December 12th. The goal of the training is to prevent adult-to-youth and peerto-peer abuse. Our members were educated on the following: 1) How to Identify Concerning Behaviors; 2) How to Monitor and Supervise Youth; 3) How to Report Emergencies or Red Flag Incidents; and 4) How to Model Safe and Appropriate Behaviors. If you didn't have a chance to sit in

abuse victims never report their abuse. Abuse, whether it's sexual, emotional or physical, leads to damaging effects that can last an entire lifetime. After Christmas-Christmas P


If you did not get that special something you were wishing for under your tree and were hoping to get it here... Well, there is always next year...Cause it just got swiped!
