Kelly White Bio

Kelly White has been with Villa Esperanza Services for over 25 years and spent the last 14 years as its CEO. Her decades of experience with the intellectually/developmentally disabled community have been crucial in helping Villa grow as an organization over the years. Under Kelly's leadership, Villa's advocacy efforts have grown and her emphasis on strategic planning has situated the organization for continued success, including the completion of Villa's Phase 1 capital campaign and now the launch of Phase 2A of \$11.5 million.

Kelly is fueled by her devotion to those Villa serves. She is instrumental when forecasting the needs of clients of all ages and providing the best programs, and emphasizes that this requires striking the right balance between the human element and the fiscal climate – and thinking outside the box.

As co-founder of the Los Angeles Coalition of Service Providers, she guides 18 other organizations to unite their voices and advocate for services for people with intellectual/developmental disabilities and their families. White's leadership continues to focus on strategies that will ensure individualized services and a continuum of care for each individual served.

Kiwanis/Villa Information

For over 60 years, Villa Esperanza Services has been proudly serving the community by providing programs for intellectually/developmentally disabled children, adults, and seniors. We change lives – from teaching a child with autism how to say "hello;" to giving an adult with Down syndrome the skills to earn a paycheck and the pride of having a job; to providing an intellectually disabled senior the opportunity to give back to the community through volunteering.

Villa was founded in 1961 by a group of mothers who believed their children with special needs deserved quality care and education. As the needs of Villa's children grew, our programs evolved to meet their needs. Today, Villa is a thriving multi-service agency providing services for over 700 children, adults, seniors and their families in Los Angeles and Ventura counties. Villa's main headquarters are in Pasadena with a satellite location in Thousand Oaks.

Villa is a unique service provider, offering individualized programs and a continuum of care over the course of a lifetime, with several our participants staying with us for 20-40 years. Our customized and comprehensive programs include Early Intervention Services for children, ages 0-5; the Villa Esperanza School for children, ages 5-22; a Speech and Language Center; an Occupational Therapy Clinic; employment services for adults; adult residences in Pasadena; independent living services for adults; and three Adult Day Programs.

Our relationship with Kiwanis spans decades, with a first gift from Kiwanis Thousand Oaks in 1994 and the first gift from Kiwanis Pasadena in 2000. Our previous Villa School Principal, Casey Gregg, also served as the President of Kiwanis Pasadena in 2019. We are grateful for the long relationship with Kiwanis Pasadena, which has donated over \$22,000 to Villa in the past 23 years. The Kiwanis mission, to improve the world by making lasting differences in the lives of children, rings true with Villa's founding mothers, who wanted to make sure their children with special needs could live fulfilling lives and make a difference in their communities by being integrated and treated equally and fairly.



- 2. Salvation Army we ring bells during the Christmas season each year to raise money for their charity. We fill backpacks for students of low-income families. We also participate in the Adopt-a-Family Program.
- 3. Elizabeth House working with homeless, young mothers and their children through support and hope.
