SPEAKER

Rebekka Manzella, MSOT, OTR/L, Director of Occupational Therapy at Villa
Rebekka is the current Director of Occupational Therapy (OT) at Villa, providing oversight for Villa's OT
programs which impact more than 100 children and families each year. Rebekka graduated with honors from
Pitzer College with a BA in Neuroscience. While volunteering at an after-school program for individuals with
developmental disabilities, she discovered occupational therapy. Through this experience she realized that OT
would allow her to merge her passion for neuroscience with her desire to facilitate meaningful change in
people's lives. She then went on to receive her Master of Science in Occupational Therapy from California
State University Dominguez Hills. Rebekka enjoys working with clients who are frequently misunderstood due
to behavioral, communication, or mental health challenges. She strives to work as a partner in the
rehabilitation process so that therapy services are always individualized, meaningful, and holistic.

VILLA ESPERANZA SERVICES

Villa's Occupational Therapy Clinic specializes in working with children and adolescents who have moderate to severe developmental disabilities, including autism and behavioral challenges. The clinic provides OT to Villa School students and outside clients school-based clients, early intervention clients, and private pay/insurance clients as well. OT focuses on the underlying skills that our clients need to be successful at school, home, and in the community, including: fine motor skills, hand-eye coordination, regulation skills, self-care skills, and visual processing skills. The occupational therapists work with clients of all ages to increase their independence in the daily activities that are meaningful to them so that they can reach their full potential.

The speaker will give her presentation and then we'll go on a tour of the Villa School campus.
