It will not be like the previous events as the players will just play and be able to go home. A voucher will be given to each player so they can purchase something "to go" from Hankered Hills. Our hole sponsors have also responded in a big way as nearly \$7,000 has been collected. This will help us in a big way to continue to serve the children of Jackson.

The Kiwanis Foundation along with the club presented the first \$10,000 of our \$40,000 pledge to the YMCA. This donation was part of the matching grant, so it was doubled. Stephanie Riggs gave a presentation at the January 21<sup>st</sup> meeting on the plans for the new building. It will be a great addition to the city and will have many new features that the current building does not. They have raised enough funds to begin the building and have a rendering that was shared at this meeting. The plan is to start construction by this fall.

At our first February board meeting, the board will begin a discussion about performing a club assessment. This was mentioned at the beginning of my year and is still something I believe would benefit the club as we go forward. It never hurts to look at what you have been doing and can you do it better or do something different. Your input will be very important in this process. With the Jackson Community Foundation already doing an assessment of needs, the club will not need to do this part. We have reached out to the organization performing this and expect to get a copy of their results later this fall. This will help us in setting our club priorities.
