I know Joe is racking his brain on the newspaper sale and how it can be done if things do not change between now and December so let him know if you have any thoughts.

I would be remiss if I did not talk about membership. Every year we seem to just hold our own or lose a few members. As an example, during this last Kiwanis year between the new members that were added and those that dropped for various reasons, our membership is at 73, down one starting this year. Of even more importance is the demographic makeup of our club. Growing our membership and making the club more representative of our community is the responsibility of each of us. 

KIWANIS NEWSPAPER SALE

Since 1918 our club has had an annual newspaper sale and with the proceeds, we furnish shoes and boots for K thru 6 grade students at Jackson Public Schools. Last year we fitted over 350 kids with shoes! The need will probably be much higher this year with unemployment running as high as it is. The problem is going to be selling papers at locations – many businesses will just not allow it as we may present a threat to their customers in transmitting COVID-19. Even though there is a remote chance, the liability to store owners is at stake and it is easier to just say "no" to us and any other organization (including the Salvation Army who has not received permission to even ring bells at many locations). With a greater need to serve the children of Jackson and less resources available. I would like to ask my fellow Kiwanians to help. In the past we have had the Gold and Silver Clubs, with the Gold being members that will donate \$100 toward the Newspaper Sale Project, and the Silver members donating \$50. Since we have only 20 to 25 members attending Friday meetings, I cannot possibly reach everyone with a sign-up sheet,



so I am asking that you email me (iwolfe@theprotectioncenter.com) with a pledge for ANY amount toward our Newspaper Sale Project. I am hopeful that a few businesses will allow us to sell but our manpower needs will be minimized and, of course, our collections will be down. We brought in over \$11,000 last year. I pray we can hit \$5,000 this year – and with your help we can.
