- **Sad News -** Past member Ford Topping passed away. He was 89. A memorial service will be held at a later date. His family requests that a memorial donation, in his memory, be made to our club's foundation. Joe Wolfe shares these details about Ford: Ford Topping joined Kiwanis in 1953, not too long after starting his dental practice. He referred to himself as the "tooth fairy." He was also known as the Mayor of Duck Lake where the Toppings lived until 2005 when they moved to East Lansing. Ford served on every Kiwanis committee there was and served as our club President in 1964. He was especially active in the Newspaper Sale, always being one of the top salespeople, took a great deal of interest in the Kiwanis Playground, that was actually maintained by Kiwanis members before the Jackson Parks Department took over, helped repair bicycles (a club project in the 1950's where bikes were refurbished and given to kids who could not afford them), and helped with "Victory Gardens" (again a 1950's project to grow vegetables and distribute them to needy families). Ford was one of the best musicians in the club and often brought his fellow banjo players (along with his wife, Laura, the tuba player) to entertain the club for a program. He had a great sense of humor and one time when a speaker did not show up entertained the club with the history of Thomas Crapper and his invention of the flush toilet. You had to be there for that one! He was also an antique collector and one of his fascinations was the apple corer - which would take the core out of the center of the apple so only the "good part" remained. You would not think there could be too many of these inventions but Ford brought about a dozen of them to the club and share hundreds of years of history and a lot of delicious apples with the members. In his later years when Ford and Laura moved to East Lansing, he found it very hard to get back to Jackson to the club meetings but he always paid his dues and always sent a Newspaper Sales check - even this year!" We will miss him.

For twelve months Karin Muller traveled from one end of Japan to the other, living among the people and exploring Japan's ancient cultural heritage and its modern ways. Karin followed the dervish mountain-cults as they undertook shamanistic austerities like fire walking, icy waterfall immersion and exorcism. She joined a samurai mounted archery team and learned how to handle a longbow on a galloping horse. She filmed the sacred art of sword making under a 24<sup>th</sup> generation master, and made a 900-mile pilgrimage in the footsteps of Japan's most famous saint.
