# Club Organization History - Outline of 100 Years of Service

## **Membership**

- 1. Chartered In January 1918 with 64 members
- 2. Membership peaked at 162 members in 1955
- 3. 2018 membership year starts with 84 members
- 4. Women were welcomed as members in 1997

#### Leadership beyond the local level

- 1. 16 members went on to serve as Lieutenant Governors of Divisions 8 & 11
- 2. 8 members accepted to role of District Governor of Michigan
- 3. 2 members became Certified Officer Trainers on the International Level
- 4. 1 member served as President of the 'Kiwanis of Michigan Foundation'

#### Awards

- 1. 17 members received the International George F. Hixson Fellows
- 2. 5 members received the International Tablet of Honor
- 3. 3 members were named the Citizen Patriot 'Person of the Year'

### Committees

- 1. there were 16 committees in 1931(the first year recorded)and 32 at the start of 2018
- committees in the early years focused on Agriculture, Attendance, Business Standards, Education and Resolutions. 1940' committees focused on the War Efforts, food and shoes for the needy and conservation
- 3. 1960' committees focused on International Relations, Public and Business Affairs, New Club Building and Spiritual Values
- 4. 1970' committees focused on Drug Awareness, Club History, Pollution, Citizenship, and youth services

- 5. 1980' committees focused on special needs and the underprivileged children. 1990' committees focused on scholarships, Community Service, Education and member retention
- 6. The last 18 years have focused on education, social issues, food and shoes for the needy, club organization and growth.
