It is time to get our largest fund raiser going! Thirty two teams will be once again planting over 1,100 flags all around Jackson. Thank you to each of you who are part of these teams! How you manage your route throughout these five holidays sets the image of our club to the community. Be proud to be a Kiwanian and give your customers great customer service! The following dates are guidelines for when the flags should be planted by and harvested by:

- Memorial Day-plant by May 23<sup>rd</sup> & harvest by May 30<sup>th</sup>
- Flag Day plant by June 13th & harvest by June 20th
- 4th of July plant by July 2nd & harvest by July 11th
- <u>Labor Day</u> through 9/11 plant by August 29<sup>th</sup> & harvest by September 15<sup>th</sup>
- <u>Veterans Day</u> (weather permitting) plant by November 11<sup>th</sup> & harvest by November 14<sup>th</sup>.

#### **Historical Tidbit**

In 1935, on the corner of Seymour and Blakley Streets in Jackson, our members erected a backdrop and laid out a diamond for baseball on an empty lot. The club purchased this lot and ran summer programs for kids here and at a park on the corner of S. Francis and E. Biddle Streets. In the 1940's our club sold the lot, on Seymour and Blakley streets. for \$1.00 to the city of Jackson as the city created a recreation department and would take over organizing the summer programs. This corner has kept the name Kiwanis Park through the years. Our club continues to maintain this park in partnership with the city. Our club has hosted a Halloween party, handing out cider and donuts, every year since 1937. In most recent years, we have annually given out 80 dozen donuts and 20 gallons of cider to over 600 'trick or treaters'!
