And that is to remember those who died in active military service for the United States of America. So, try not to look at Flag planting as a task to check off, but rather a proud service you are honored to be chosen to perform.

It may seem rather over dramatic, but when I carry the Stars and Strips to each sleeve, I have visions of the battle harder soldiers in Iwo Jima giving it all their might to bring the flag to it's full height. I think of scenes from movies and books of D-Day, where the English Channel turned red with American blood from bullet wounds and severed limbs. I would like to think I would have the guts and the American spirit to load on those boats headed for entrenched German defense.

I think of my father and the members of this community he has introduced me to who fought in Vietnam because they believe in America. I remember when I was a teenager and Paul Gorzyca, a younger Vietnam Vet from Jackson, told me that when my father volunteered to join the Marines and travel to Vietnam in 1967, that was when the War was raging hard.

Remembering Bob Eberhert, a passed Kiwanian, was a Korean War Vet. And Ken Hickey, a passed Kiwanian, and Navy Vet, recalled very clearly the Red Cross charging them for donuts on their way home from the Pacific. I chuckled when he mentioned that during a meeting, and though blind, look directly at me across the room. It wasn't that I thought it was funny, but rather I had read about the incident at some time in my life and couldn't believe I would ever have the honor to know someone who lived it. Kenny, if your listening, "I'm sorry I laughed, but it was not at your expense".

My generation has not seen the mass war deaths like my predecessors, but I knew Matthew Soper's brothers and pray for their family when I see remembrance of him. Sgt Soper was killed in Iraq in 2007.

So, while it may seem challenging to fit the Flag planting and harvesting into your schedule, remember you have a real duty this Memorial Day to honor those who fought and died for this country. Of course, those I mentioned did not die for this country, but they fought alongside those who did not come back to raise families and live long lives. We live our lives to the fullest to honor those who didn't make it back. Salute!
