Belize, Guatemala & Honduras on February 5
More than 3000 years before the time of Christ, a
consortium of autonomous City/Kingdoms
developed and flourished in a region now mapped
as southern Mexico, Belize, Guatemala and
Honduras. They thrived until around the fifteenth
Century A.D., leaving behind astounding
monuments to the energy, industry and ingenuity of
their populations. They built temples rivaling those
of Egypt... perhaps not as large but more
extensive. A calendar more accurate than our own,
Astronomical observations used in constructing
their buildings reveal a surprising degree of
sophistication and knowledge.

Today the descendants of those ancient Maya still populate this same region of Central America. Many are still farmers. But some are cowboys. Young men still rope and brand cattle today in Guatemala much as it must have been done in the western U.S. 150 years ago.
