Feeding Those in Need At Bennett and the Interfaith Shelter

We had a great first Kids Against Hunger packaging experience at Bennett Elementary School in Jackson on Friday, May 8. The children especially liked making packages of food that would feed other children who were in need. We packaged 10,968 meals and all the food went to food pantries in the Jackson area.

Our club donates \$2,800 for the dry ingredients that go into each meal. We partner with the Kids Against Hunger organization which provides the soy, rice, dried vegetables and chicken flavoring that goes into the packaged meals. Kiwanians supervised the children, who measure, package, weigh and seal each package of food. Three Key Clubbers (President Rachel Cunningham, Media Chief Parker Wilkinson and James Smith) helped set up and supervise the first group of children.
