Our Flag Project Kicks off this Month

Overview – Our club's largest fund raiser consists of 30-35 teams planting and harvesting more than 1,000 flags throughout Jackson County on the following five holidays: Memorial Day, Flag Day, 4th of July, Labor Day through 9/11, and Veterans Day (weather permitting). Each team is made up of 2-3 club members and team routes have 10 – 60 flags (depending on what the members can handle). Each flag costs \$30/year. Project costs for mailings, flags, poles & PVC sleeves are about \$3,000/year. So you can see – if we continue to work together and make this a quality service to our community – we make around \$27,000/year.

SO WHAT DO WE NEED TO KNOW Preparation –

You will receive your route along with the combination to the Blue Bay Storage company gate and combination to the lock on our storage unit:

- New customers on your route sleeves will be set by the Prep committee
- Get familiar with your route before it is time to plant for the first time
 - 1. Old sleeve take a stick with you to test how straight it stands –reset or adjust the sleeve as needed –don't relocate it without calling Miss Dig 811
 - 2. Spray paint around the sleeve and on the edge of the road, check your measurements from the road for easy location of the sleeve when planting
- Familiarize yourself with the storage unit check location and combinations, figure how to fit flags in your vehicle, cans of white spray paint are there for you to use for marking

Flag Planting & Harvesting

- Time Line plant your flags 3-5 days before the holiday & harvest them 3-5 days after the holiday (strive to have them in for one week as a courtesy to the customer) FOR MEMORIAL DAY: PLANT MAY 20-22, HARVEST MAY 28-30.
- Care of flags don't take down wet flags be sure they are dry before rolling and storing (bring damaged or badly faded flags back to the storage unit, in the designated repair area and take a replacement)
- Use the log sheet at the storage unit to acknowledge sleeves, paint, flags taken and repairs needed

Substitutes

- Plan Ahead Look at the five holidays decide if you will need help. Connect with a sub before you need one – have them go with you on the route so they know it.
- Emergencies make them few and far between be accountable for your route – how you manage it reflects on the whole club – make your customers glad you are their team!
