Kiwanis Foundation Brings Disc Golf to Jackson

The Kiwanis Foundation of Jackson recently voted unanimously to commit \$15,000 to a Disc Golf Course at Ella Sharp Park.

The money will pay for the equipment needed for the 18-hole course. The Jackson Parks and Recreation Department already has received a grant from the Weatherwax Foundation to remove invasive species from the wooded area where the course will be constructed. That work already has begun.




The Foundation will provide the money – in the club's name – over two years. In exchange, the course will be called the Kiwanis Disc Golf Course. All of the discs (Frisbee-like plastic discs) will have the Kiwanis "K" and the course name, as will the launching pads, hole monuments and "catchers" for the discs.

Course users will check in at the traditional golf clubhouse, and play is free. If a player doesn't have his or her own discs to play with, he or she will be able to check out discs for free. The course is expected to be ready for play next summer.

Disc Golf is growing in popularity across the country, particularly among youngsters, young people and families. That's why it fits so well with the Kiwanis mission! Adding to our excitement is the location at Ella Sharp Park, near the city's southeast side where many low-income children reside.

Check out videos of disc golf online. This is going to be a fun project, with opportunities for sweat equity from club members! -- Foundation President Eileen Lehnert
