
DYNAMIC DUO



The Kiwanis Flowering Tree Project

The Kiwanis Flowering Tree Project was founded in 2013 by Stan Mazur. The Jackson Northwest Club took the initiative to plant an abundance of flowering trees throughout Cascades Park which subsequently our club voted unanimously to carry on with the project. These trees would serve two main purposes. One, it would undoubtedly beautify the park and secondly the trees would serve as a memorial for lost loved ones in the Jackson Community by being adopted by donors.

The Kiwanis Flowering Tree Project is a stand-alone 501C(3), has a board of directors, a bank account, and a website to provide potential donors with a road map on how to purchase a tree or obtain answers to their specific questions.

To date three (3) phases has been approved by the County Parks Board. Phase 1 consists of 91 trees along Randolph Street of which 79 have been adopted. Phase 2 consists of 33 trees around the fishing pond/pavilion of which all have been adopted. Lastly, Phase 3 consists of 33 trees near Cascades Manor House and the round-a-bout of which 19 have been adopted. So in conclusion, before Phase 4 is developed and presented to the County Parks Board for approval the remaining 26 trees, which have been planted, need donors.

I would like to thank and recognize the fellow Kiwanians who have purchased a tree.

Dr. Jim Schindler, Mary Csage, Linda Hayes, Jim Justin, Phil Krauss, Clark & Linda Danley, Dennis Hackett, and Stan & Meredith Mazur.

The cost of a tree is \$500 which includes the purchase, the donor tag, perpetual care, and most importantly free replacement if the tree is damaged.
