JUNE'S feature story by Monica and Marla Marsh sure elicited some response from Kiwanians around the district. Feedback was mostly positive, but there were were also a few negative ones as well. My goal with the Buckeye Bulletin is to always work to enhance understanding of issues and how they affect children. Kiwanis is not a political organization, nor is it a secular organization. Advocating for youth protection and enhancing quality of life for children though does fit within our mission statement. Comments on all stories published are always welcome as we work together to improve the world one child and one community at a time.

Turning our focus now to an important update. At the House of Delegates of the 2023 International Convention in Minneapolis on June 24th, the delegate body defeated a board proposed bylaws ammendment to increase member dues by \$30. Several ammendments to the ammendment were also defeated. While there are varying opinions on this topic, it is highly likely that another ammendment will come to the delegates in 2024 in Denver. It is also imminent that service cuts from Kiwanis International will occur to remedy the budget deficits. Finally, it was announced that on February 1, 2024, Past International President Paul Palazzolo will take over the reigns as Executive Director of Kiwanis International.







MAX the mannequin is a recent addition to our district Kiwanis office. He is part of our historical archive display. This gorgeous costume was utilized in an "initiation ceremony" for the "Veteran Select Kiwanis Old Timers" group and he is holding a certificate of induction.

From what we have gleaned from archives, this was the all-male predecessor to the "Kardinals" group for past Lieutenant Governors. A new group of inductees joined each year, and at least one special inductee was singled out for participating in the induction skit.

We had several additional costumes, some with headdresses like Max, some without, and one which includes a "Buffalo Head" head-dress.

Each year during the annual convention, these men would gather for a couple of hours of comraderie, laughter and the fun of "roasting" the newest inductees. International Trustees were part of the ceremony, and the script is best described as politically incorrect and ... ornery.

Several years ago, when I first started working for the district, I asked a couple of people about the box of costumes, pictures, strange banner, and the script. Both Al Justice (Governor 79/80) and Don Williams (International President 85/86) simply smiled and refused to divulge any information.

While the district office may never know exactly what happened in those sessions, we have the evidence something fun was occurring behind closed doors.
