From the desk of the
DISTRICT SECRETARY



ANNUALLY, the District Secretary provides a report to the delegates at the District Convention Business Session. I thought that this information should be shared with everyone in the District so here is what I reported in Springfield.

"Last July 31st we had 6,100 members in 209 clubs. This year our membership has dropped once again to a total of 5,847 members as of July 31, 2023, a net loss year over year of 4.2%. We presently have 1 new Kiwanis club since our last convention, the Wapakoneta Kiwanis Club, but through either merger, charter resignation or revocation we have lost much more than that, presently sitting with 193 active clubs in the district. I am pleased that there are several active club openings occurring and we hope to organize at least a few more before the end of September. We have made some decent gains in membership this administrative year as we are presently at a plus 213 members from where we started on October 1st, and if we can keep our normal attrition in August and September to under 3%, we may actually see a growth in membership for the first time in many years. It is imperative for each of us to share with others the opportunity to serve children through a Kiwanis experience if we desire for this great organization to survive. From the district office, we pledge to continue to do all that we can to support clubs in their growth and service which includes several new initiatives that will be proposed in the coming year."



AS we approach the new Kiwanis year, it is time to install our District Officers! Governor-Elect Jason Miller has planned a special day for this Installation. In conjunction with the District Board Installation, there will be a day long event for Key Club, Circle K, and Kiwanis District leaders at Flying Horse Farms in Mt. Gilead on September 23, 2023.

On September 23rd, there will be the Tri-K Leadership Retreat. Beginning at 10AM, the 2023-24 District Boards of Kiwanis, Key Club, and Circle K will be meeting to share in leadership development, strengthening of Kiwanis-Family relationships, and service. Some highlights include a motivating keynote presentation from Kiwanis International Director of Global Membership & Engagement Christopher Martz, breakout sessions to discuss Tri-K topics, and a service project to benefit Flying Horse Farms. All 2023-24 Lt. Governors are requested to be in attendance during the day. Registration for the Tri-K Leadership Retreat is \$20; lunch is included. Guests are welcome to register as well.

At 6PM, the 2023-24 District Board Installation for the District Officers and Chairs. Dinner with drink tickets is \$25. This dress for the event is "Kiwanis casual." The installation will be fun and casual at this beautiful camp. Bring some extra cash to participate in the fundraisers for both Flying Horse Farms and the KICK Fund (Kiwanis' Investment in Circle K).

Additionally, guests are invited to stay at the "Big Red Barn" in dormitory style housing with private bathrooms or in a cabin that can house up to 14 guests with shared bathrooms. Linens are included. Single occupancy is \$90/person. Occupancy of 2 or more is \$80/person. Guests who stay overnight can also register for breakfast for \$11.

From the desk of the DISTRICT GOVERNOR-ELECT



SEPTEMBER is here once again and that means many things to many different people. In Kiwanis circles, it is a signal for the final month of the administrative year. A time to give one final push on annual goals, a sprint to recruit a few more members and retain those that have served this year. It is also a time for new officers to finalize plans for the upcoming year, set goals and find ways to make their visions a reality for their clubs. It is indeed a bittersweet time. But one thing holds true for all clubs. A wise person coined the phrase “service is the lifeblood of any organization. Everything flows from it and is nourished by it.” While the context of this quote was not directly about Kiwanis, I think that this phrase can hold deep meaning for every club and every member. Without service, who are we? If we are not trying new and different service projects, how will we thrive? Few will argue that the best service project in Kiwanis is in fact, our Service Leadership Programs. I wholeheartedly agree with that statement and I want to share two opportunities to make this idea even more relevant for your club.

First, let’s not forget about Kiwanis One Day. This day is held annually on a Saturday in October. This year, that will be October 21st. This Kiwanis International Initiative asks clubs to partake in community service projects with their SLPs and other local Kiwanis Clubs. What a great way to create a new service project tradition, or support your local Kiwanis Family with a current initiative. Perhaps you can plan to clean up a park, volunteer at a local hospital, or support a local domestic violence shelter. It doesn’t matter what your project is, just get out there and serve. If your club is struggling to come up with an idea, work with your SLPs and ask them what they would like to do as a joint service project. I am confident that together a great idea will unfold. Imagine the impact if every single club in Ohio, nearly 200 clubs, all came together on Kiwanis One Day in the name of making an impact together.

Secondly, I want to take a moment to talk about the 2023-2024 District Service Project (commonly referred to as the Governor’s Project or the First Family Project). If you were able to attend the workshop at District Convention facilitated by 23-24 District Service Chair Amanda Flaute, you may be just as excited as I am! Our District Service Project will focus on our Service Leadership Programs! Here in the Buckeye Bulletin, you will find a page with the entire outline of the program for next year. If SLPs truly are our best service project, let’s find ways to Support, Develop and Engage them to be tomorrow’s leaders. The program will highlight ways that we can support their leadership development, recognize their advisors and perform acts of service together. I encourage all clubs to strive to achieve as much interaction with their SLPs as possible.

This is a great opportunity to support our SLPs and even participate in Kiwanis One Day. Start your planning now for an October event so that you too can be part of something bigger and make a difference. - Perform a new joint service project with a Service Leadership Program
- Conduct a joint meeting with a Service Leadership Program

Support:

- Make a designated donation to the Ohio District Kiwanis Foundation, earmarked for Aktion, Key Club, Key Leader, Circle K (KICK), Builders Club, K-Kids
- At least two Kiwanis members attend a District Event for any of the SLPs
- Recognize all club SLP Kiwanis and Faculty Advisors in some way

Develop:

- Sponsor at least one student to attend Key Leader
- Sponsor at least 2 Key Club, CKI or Aktion club members to their respective District or International Events
- Support a leadership development activity for Aktion Club, Builders Club, Key Club, CKI or K-Kids

Recognition will be provided to clubs that complete at least 6 of the 9 items above with at least one in each category of Engage, Develop and Support.

ODKF PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Thank You - Ohio District Kiwanians



As outgoing ODKF President, it gives me great joy to reflect on the success of the district, the clubs and SLPs ODKF supported, and most importantly, the children and communities we were able to serve this year. For those who attended DCON, you heard a little of what I am about to share.

I want to express my sincere appreciation for the work of the ODKF board and committees. It was a true team effort that allowed us to accomplish what we did as an organization, in support of the clubs and SLPs within the district. We are better, stronger and more effective, when we truly work together.

My favorite memory as president was the ODKF "First Family" service project at MidYear. We assembled 155 Komfort Bags for children in foster care and with the help of LTGs and club officers, they were delivered to family shelters that week. This year, ODKF provided over \$38,000 in grant monies and special funding for service projects, supporting 45 clubs and SLPs. We recognized twelve clubs with 50 – 100 years of service. We presented \$500 in special funding to all SLPs and Key Leader. We created policies that will allow us to continue these efforts in the future. We improved our grant submission process and extended grant cycles to better serve the district. Through your generosity, support and trust, we grew our managed funds to over \$2 million with \$1M in Club Advised Funds (CAF). We advanced our initiatives of the ODKF Strategic Plan to better serve Ohio Kiwanis members. At DCON, Kiwanis members received new ODKF pins which reflect our updated brand and serves as a reminder that as a Kiwanian, YOU are a valuable member of the Ohio District Kiwanis Foundation.

While talking with a friend recently, he shared a project they've done with their Kiwanis clubs in years past. Todd, works with www.LighthouseSWFL.org. Their mission is to empower people of all ages living with low vision or blindness to remain independent and productive in our society. The project that their Kiwanis clubs have supported is a "beeping" Easter Egg Hunt. I would like to make one final request for you to take advantage of the grant monies available to you through ODKF and pursue a very special Easter Egg Hunt in 2023, with SLPs, especially Aktion Club, and promote, host, and execute, a very special Easter Egg Hunt for everyone including: disadvantaged, disabled, poor vision or blind children in your communities. Be creative, have fun, and show Kiwanis love to all children!

In closing, I want to encourage you to become involved in ODKF if you aren't already. I PROMISE, it will be one of the most rewarding experiences you'll ever have as a Kiwanian. You will have an impact on Kiwanis clubs, SLPs, and Ohio communities. Rita Corbin, is the incoming ODKF president, I know she's already looking for Kiwanians, who are ready to make a difference by serving on a committees. KIWANIS CHILDREN'S FUND GRANTS

HERE TO HELP YOUR CLUB

The Kiwanis Children's Fund is here to help as you begin planning the 2023-24 service year. If your club is seeking funding for a new project or planning to expand upon an existing project, it might be eligible for a grant. Eligible projects must support activities within at least one Kiwanis International cause area: health and nutrition, education and literacy, and youth leadership development.

Here are grants available to clubs in good standing with Kiwanis International and the Kiwanis Children's Fund:

Club grant

A club grant helps address an unmet need that affects children in your community or elsewhere – by supporting a project that provides long-term benefits that can be sustained by the club. The first step toward this grant is to submit a Letter of Inquiry (LOI) using our online grant-making platform, [Foundant](#). An LOI provides the Children's Fund with an overview of how your club plans to meet a need in your community. You will be asked to provide a project overview, timeline, budget and community needs overview.

Funding decisions are made twice a year. For a March 1 funding decision, the LOI is due before November 1. LOIs received between November 2 and March 1 will be considered for August 1 funding. Microgrant

The microgrant program provides between US\$250 and US\$1,000 to support service projects for clubs with 35 or fewer members. There are fewer requirements and a shorter decision period than Club Grants.

Clubs can apply through [Foundant](#) beginning October 1. Applications received by the first of each month will receive a decision via email by the 15th of the same month. Approved grants will be paid monthly beginning in December.

Although the application will not open until October 1, your club can still get an early start on its application. Simply log into your club's [Foundant](#) account (or create one if your club does not already have one). This will allow you to preview the application. We can also provide the question list to your club upon request.

Pediatric Medicine Support Grant

Funded by generous gifts from the Kiwanis district governors in 2005-06 and 2006-07, the [Pediatric Medicine Support Grant](#) helps clubs execute service projects at local children's hospitals or medical facilities that provide pediatric care.
