MEMBERSHIP MATTERS

The Two for Two Membership Recruitment Helps Kiwanis Clubs Grow

Would your Kiwanis club like to increase its membership? As most of us know, new members for our Kiwanis club bring new ideas, more hands for service, more fellowship, and greater club vitality. Does your club have an ongoing membership plan in place? Are multiple members of your club helping with membership development? Membership growth is most successful when your club has a membership committee and all members help with the process and keep it top of mind on an ongoing basis.

The **two for two membership recruitment process** is a simple and effective ongoing membership tool that works for most Kiwanis Clubs and when used on a regular basis has a high percentage of success. The plan in a nutshell is two current club members calling on two prospective club members on a monthly basis. The plan is simple by design and implementation of the plan is summarized below:

- 1. Your club should discuss its desire to grow membership and agree that it wants to make a concerted effort to grow the club.
- 2. Once your club has agreed to focus on membership development and adopt the two for two program you are ready to begin the process:
 - a. Ask each club member to submit names of friends, associates, and acquaintances they think would be good Kiwanis members. When thinking of names, it is often good to complete a club roster analysis which is simply reviewing various professions and think of those professions your club may not have any representation from. Also think of skill sets, such as financial, technology, organizational, etc., that are needed in your club and who you may know that has those skills. The primary focus of this is to create a prospect list of who you would like to call on to invite to Kiwanis.
 - b. Then two club members should choose two individuals from the prospect list that they both know and schedule appointments to meet with them during the month and talk about Kiwanis including things such as the impact your club has in the community, why you value your Kiwanis membership, etc. The hope is since the prospect knows both club members already and then realizes they each value their Kiwanis experience they may find value in experiencing Kiwanis as well and want to join your club.
 - c. The next month two other members of the club should repeat the process as outlined above by calling on two different prospective members they both know. Since only two calls are made a month by two individuals this spreads the membership efforts among many and no one person will need to do it all the time. Depending on your club size any one individual may only need to make calls a couple times during the year.
 - d. Repeat this process each month of the year and at the end you will have made twenty-four prospect calls by just talking to friends and acquaintances and hopefully have a number of new members to show for the efforts.

In addition to helping to grow your club this process helps spread the word of Kiwanis and its service efforts in your community.

Ohio District Kiwanis Foundation Ready to help!

Each year Ohio observes a Statewide Severe Weather Awareness Week, targeting a time before the spring severe weather season typically begins. This year Ohio's Severe Weather Awareness Week will be observed from March 17 through March 23.

Spring and summer can bring severe weather to Ohio. During the late evening of Memorial Day in 2019 11 tornadoes touched down in the Miami Valley, leaving behind an estimated \$1 billion in damage. In total 19 tornadoes hit Ohio that evening.

Tornadoes hit Celina, West Milton, Brookville, Trotwood, Dayton, Beavercreek, and many other communities. Even today you can still see the damage left behind by these powerful storms.

Area Kiwanis Clubs responded with assistance for those impacted by the natural disaster. Some were able to secure grants from the Kiwanis Children's Fund to help purchase supplies needed to aid in the recovery.

Although the Kiwanis Children's Fund no longer has funds dedicated specifically for disaster relief, there are still funds available. The Ohio District Kiwanis Foundation maintains our own Disaster Relief Fund.

Requests can be made by any Kiwanis or Service Leadership Program Club or Division, When making the request the Club or Division must be able to provide information about the specific needs that are to be addressed and the means for addressing these needs. This may be a broad description of the intended use.

However, none of this is possible without the generosity of Kiwanis Clubs and their members. We hope that during Severe Weather Awareness Week you, your club, or your Division will consider making a gift to the Ohio District Kiwanis Foundation's Disaster Relief Fund to help ensure funds are available when a natural disaster strikes.

In 2013, 25 million people worldwide rooted for Diana Nyad as she reached the Florida shore, at long last achieving her 35-year quest of becoming the first person to swim from Cuba to Florida. Speaking the words "never ever give up" to the wildly cheering crowd on a Key West beach on September 2, 2013, Nyad demonstrated to the world the power of the human spirit. Nyad's amazing record: 110.86 miles in 52 hours, 54 minutes, 18 seconds.

A prominent sports journalist, filing over 30 years for National Public Radio, "The New York Times" and others, Nyad has earned her place as one of our most compelling storytellers. Her memoir, "Find a Way," has earned worldwide praise. Her groundbreaking piece on her childhood sexual abuse for "The New York Times" drew a passionate response from around the world.

"NYAD" — a feature film starring Annette Bening as Nyad — was released in November 2023. Also, a uniquely entertaining and inspiring public speaker, Nyad fulfilled the lifelong dream of bringing her performance of her play "The Swimmer" to the storied off-Broadway Minetta Lane Theater in 2019.

Nyad and her best friend and Cuba swim expedition leader Bonnie Stoll have further collaborated with their nationwide walking initiative EverWalk, sparking America to become a nation of walkers. In turn, EverWalk has recently launched yet another initiative, OceansCommit, hosting walks along our shorelines and asking individuals and businesses to reduce single-use plastic.








KIWANIS INTERNATIONAL PRESIDENT KATRINA BARANKO TO VISIT OHIO

PUBLIC RELATIONS MATTERS,

Don't give up on traditional print media!

As someone with a long and continuing career in the newspaper business, I love seeing when our clubs are getting excellent press for their good works in their communities.

A great recent example, pictured here, was the terrific coverage *The Willoughby News-Herald* gave to the Kiwanis Club of Kirtland's efforts to start a K-Kids program.

While we tend to get excited when one of our social media posts gets a few dozen or even a hundred likes, hundreds if not thousands of people saw this big story and photo in the local paper.

Not every story idea we send into the newspaper will get this kind of attention. But when we can nurture a relationship with our local paper, and make it easier for the journalists to do their jobs, the likelihood increases!

How do we do that? Send in your information well ahead of time, to give them time to make plans for a story and photos. When you do send in a press release early, feel free to send out a reminder closer to the event.

Have someone in your club -- often the president,

but could be another designee with gifts in terms of communication — reach out regularly to the editor or reporter to keep that connection warm and welcoming Better yet, invite someone working for the paper to join your club!

Finally, local papers often are looking for content written by someone in the community, whether that's a well-written press release or column on the virtues of service, etc. Who can do that for your club?
