I.In accordance with Article VI, Section 3, of the Ohio District of Kiwanis International Bylaws, official notice is hereby given that the 107th Annual Convention of the Ohio District of Kiwanis International will be held at the Eastwood Event Centre, 5555 Youngstown Warren Road, Niles, Oh 4446 from August 1-3, 2025

II.In accordancewith Article VI, Section 6, of the District Bylaws, each chartered club in good standing in the district shall be entitled to seat up to three (3) Delegates, two (2) of whom should be the President and the President-Designate.

Three (3) Delegates and the (3) Alternates of each club must be certified to the District Secretary by the president and secretary of said club, using the Certificate of Election of Delegates and Alternates form. Eble earns Litwack Leadership Award

Kiwanis International and its International Key Club announced that Ohio Key club advocate and adviser Jeff Eble has been named recipient of this year's Marc H. Litwack Leadership award.

Now in its fourth year, this award honors former Key Club members who have demonstrated extraordinary leadership and made significant contributions to their professions and communities.

The award honors the legacy of Marc Litwack -- a former KI Governor, Circle K International and Key Club international leader -- by celebrating alumni who exemplify personal growth, service and a commitment to excellence. These traits shape leaders while encouraging prospective members, and the award als



o reinforces the importance of service and leadership as cornerstone of personal and community success.

During the 1970-71 school year, Jeffrey Eble was an 11th-grade student at Medina High School. He became one of the first Medina HS Key club charter members, and then went onto to serve during his senior year as his club's second treasurer -- all before graduation -- then attended the University of Akron before returning to Medina City Schools to serve as its business manager.

Eble has served as a member of the Ohio District Kiwanis committee on Key Club for the past 19 years, the first 18 of which he served as assistant administrator for Zone G, mentoring the Key Club Lt. Governors; serving as lead adviser for the annual district convention; and also serving as lead adviser for the annual International tour.

For the past 21 years, Eble has served the Ohio District of Key Club as district administrator, and is the longest serving Key Club District Administrator in Ohio Kiwanis history.

"Mr. Eble exemplifies the most important experience Key Club hopes to give its members: empowering leadership," said Olufemi Odiah, 2024-25 Key Club governor for Ohio.

"When I served as Lt. Governor, I worked closely with Mr. Eble as Fall Rally chair. ... I can confidently say that such an achievement would not have been possible without his expertise and strategic planning," said Rhea Pasuleti, ODKCI Immediate Past Governor.

"Mr. Eble has always ensured our district board could continue our creativity while being able to develop our leadership and organizational skills."

"I first met Jeff Eble in 1996 as a newly elected Key Club Lt. Governor," said past Ohio Gov. Jamie Kaufman. "While Eble was not my Zone Administrator, he took a genuine interest in all of the student leaders on the board and worked to mentor each of us. ... He is as engaged today as he has ever been. He has provided that guiding hand and stable presence that helped Ohio Key club navigate the challenges faced by the global COVID-19 pandemic."

Eble joins the following prestigious past leaders to receive this award -

- *2022 Bill Nelson, 1959-60 Key club international president
- *2023 Sue Petrisin, 1979-80 Key club governor
- *2024 Scott Sims, 1983-84 Key club governor

As recipient, Eble will now attend the 2025 Key Club international convention in Orlando and will also teach a course for the Global Leadership certificate program and serve on the 2026 Nomination committee.


The campaign has generated \$7.9 million in donations and pledges so far, with \$1.6 million coming from the Midwest Region including \$320,457 from Ohio clubs.


