















Granville named Club of the Year


In the midst of another banner year of serving its community, the Kiwanis Club of Granville was named Ohio District Kiwanis Club of the Year by Gov. Kelly Brown during this year's District Convention.

The governor saw firsthand how important the club is to its community when she attended the four-day July 4 Celebration in Granville. Everyone in town knows that Kiwanians are responsible for this huge celebration, making it a true Signature Project that helps the club add members every year.

But the club's inspiring efforts do not end there.

It sponsors SLP clubs at every level, developing hearts





One highlight of the current Kiwanian year is the club's support of Gov. Kelly's emphasis on protecting pollinators.

Members created a 300-sqiuare-foot pollinator garden at Wildwood Park in the village of Granville with assistance from the Licking County Master Gardeners Volunteers and the Licking County Pollinator Pathway organization. The Aktion Club donated \$75 to purchase two of the native shrubs.

Many volunteers helped plant, weed and water the garden, including 15 club members, three Granville High School Key Club members and one GHS Rotary Interact Club. It received \$250 from the Ohio District Kiwanis Foundation.

Members designed signage with Kiwanis branding and are part of the official Pollinator Pathway Project



in Licking Counity. They passed out poppy seed packets in memory of Norma Krueger, who passed away.

Members helped Aktion Club plant flower containers and create seed packets and seed bombs which they passed out at DCON.

Berea Club's Jeffs are honored for huge membership efforts

At the 107th Annual Ohio District Kiwanis convention in Niles, Ohio, on August 1-2, Jeff Wayner from the Berea Kiwanis Club was selected as the "Kiwanian of the Year" within the State of Ohio for 2024-2025.

In addition, fellow club member Jeff Haas was selected as "Club President of the Year."

There are more than 5,500 Kiwanis members in Ohio within 191 clubs.

The awards were presented by Kiwanis Governor Kelly Brown. The inscription on Wayner's plaque read "For exemplifying the ideals of Kiwanis and expanding the Kiwanis family in the Berea community."

More specifically, he was awarded this distinction for chairing the club's New Membership Recruitment committee. His leadership, dedication,



and commitment for expanding the club's membership resulted in 21 new members being inducted into the club since the beginning of 2025.

The inscription on Haas' plaque read "For excellence in leadership and exceeding the expectations of Club President."

He was recognized for his leadership in promoting the creation of the New Member Recruitment committee and supporting and advocating their efforts.

Amy Zimmerman inspires with 'Grinch' speech

The following is the text of the speech Amy Zimmerman shared during the International Convention in Pittsbugh last month. It was too inspirational to not share with the rest of the Mighty Ohio District, especially as she moves into a new role as an elected board of trustees member for Kiwanis International!

Have you ever had a Grinch moment? First, let me define it for you. A Grinch moment is that instant when something so powerful, so moving, makes your heart grow three sizes.





That moment reinforced why we must continue to champion Kiwanis programs – because when we do, we create spaces where everyone belongs, where every voice matters, and where service truly changes lives. "It truly made my heart grow 3 sizes."

Kiwanis is the engine of transformation, the spark for these Grinch moments. And I want to keep them happening – for everyone.

So how do we ensure that these moments continue?

<u>First, by Inspiring Clubs –</u> Every Kiwanis club has a unique identity. My mission is to empower clubs to rediscover their local purpose, embrace their strengths, and shape experiences that matter.
