Project



First Family Project seeks to fulfill wishes for families

The serious illness of a child creates a crisis for the entire family – often leading to long stays in the hospital, fear about the future and disruption of family routines. On any given day, hundreds of families in Ohio are dealing with these realities -- facing the prospect of what can become a long ordeal.

These families are the focus of the 2025-2026 First Family Project, known as "One True Wish." The project calls on Kiwanians across the Ohio District to support two nonprofit organizations that help families in medical crisis: The Make-A-Wish Foundation and Ronald McDonald House Charities.

The One True Wish Project urges Kiwanis divisions,

Kiwanis clubs and individual Kiwanians to support fundraising for Make-A-Wish, an organization that organizes special experiences for "Wish Kids" and their families throughout Ohio and beyond. Make-A-Wish is active in more than 50 countries around the world, has granted more than 550,000 special wishes and is supported entirely by donations.

The One True Wish project aims to raise \$25,000 during the 2025-26 Kiwanis year. The project encourages Kiwanis Clubs to undertake fundraisers for Make-A-Wish and to donate funds raised to the One True Wish project via the Ohio District Kiwanis Foundation.

Make-A-Wish focuses its effort on the "Wish Kids" – and looks to them to identify their "One True Wish." The organization then arranges travel and specialized experiences designed to give the Wish Kid and the family the chance to "leave care behind" – at least for a little while. Families who have taken part in a Make-A-Wish trip typically describe it as "the experience of a lifetime" and the source of treasured memories.

The One True Wish project also calls on Ohio Kiwanians to support the six Ronald McDonald Houses in Ohio – located in Columbus, Cincinnati, Cleveland, Dayton, Akron and Toledo – as well as the one in Huntington, West Virg., that serves families in Southern Ohio. The project asks Kiwanis Clubs to organize volunteer support for the Ronald McDonald Houses — to help prepare meals, stock pantries and help with other projects as requested.

The One True Wish project was inspired by the life of Lauren Diane Hudson, who experienced repeated stays at Dayton Children's Medical Center (now Dayton Children's Hospital). Lauren and her family loved her special Wish Kid trip to Disneyland, Universal Studios Orlando and Sea World in 2001. Lauren passed away at Dayton Children's Medical Center at age 12 Jan. 8, 2002, surrounded by her family.



However, before I could really start, I needed to finish out my fourth term as Lt. Governor for Division 8.



Past Kiwanis Year had many highlights

Thanks to all you for a successful year! It has been an honor to lead our Ohio district for the past year. As we closed out 2024-25 and enter into the new Kiwanis year, I thought it was only fitting to share some of the year's accomplishments.

Events

We kicked off the year with the District Installation event Sept. 8 at Capital University in Bexley. We had 90 attendees and lots of fun with the Garden Party Theme, which tied with the Pollinator Project.

In March we hosted the MidYear Education Day. This year's theme was Spread Your Wings and Take Flight! Held at the Quest Conference Center in Westerville, we had 190 attendees and got great reviews.

In June, 165 of us Ohioans traveled to Pittsburgh for International Convention. Our district had a goal of 85 attendees, which we crushed at 195 percent! We were entertained by an excellent keynote speech by NFL legend Terry Bradshaw. Ohio's own Amy Zimmerman was elected International Trustee and Neha Pasupuleti was voted in as Vice President of Circle K International. Ohio Aktion clubbers met up with Pennsylvania Aktion clubbers and had the first



ever joint event at International convention; the event was highlighted by a visit with International President Lee Kwan Yong and International President Elect Michael Mulhal.

In August we held our District Convention in Niles Ohio – it was The Place to BEE! We had a super fun experience with nearly 200 attendees. We played SINGO and held a BEE-BOP Ball. We elected our new leaders, Governor Marcia Copeland Hudson, Governor Elect Judy Raub and F&S Committee members, Willie Heggins.

BEE A HERO - The Governor's Pollinator Project.

More than \$17,000 was raised through donations to the project from various clubs and divisions. We also received a \$5,500 grant from Kiwanis Children's Fund for the project. We collaborated with Save Ohio Bees on how to raise awareness and manage the project. We also enjoyed a keynote address from their founder Tracy Teucsher at MidYear. There were 38 grants issued to clubs and SLPs for Pollinator Projects.

The project received media coverage through local TV and several newspaper articles. It was also promoted at various events, and I taught five pollinator classes at Shelby Day camp! Grant money is still available. You may apply for a Pollinator Project grant through Dec. 31. It's not too late to sow seeds or plan for next spring. Be sure to record your project or your own personal pollinator garden on our ODK website. All gardens count!

Expanding our Kiwanis Family

We started new Kiwanis clubs in Greater Loveland and Fairport Harbor! We are currently working to build clubs in Conneaut and Huber Heights. Two of our Kiwanis Clubs have had tremendous growth with Berea adding 19 new members and Bay Village adding 35 new members. WOW!

At last count Ohio had a net gain of 238 members, but this is before the October purge. We won't know our finals until mid-October...fingers crossed!

Ohio Student Leadership Programs are growing too!

Circle K has 15 clubs with 292 members, which represents 28 percent growth during the past two years! Ella Powell's Governor's project, Service from the Heart, has already exceeded its fundraising goal of \$1,000 and reset the goal to \$5,000. The district received the following awards at ICON: The Distinguished District, Distinguished Governor- Neha Pasupuleti, Distinguished Editor- Ella Powell, Outstanding District Administrator- Chad Gardner, Distinguished Kiwanis Committee Member- Shawn Sech, and Distinguished Service Initiative Involvement, 2nd plan Gold Division Outstanding Club Achievement, 2nd Place Outstanding Single Service- Baldwin Wallace University. Great year Circle K!

Key Club has 205 clubs and about 8,500 members. They are working on four new clubs and one recharter, as well as pursuing the re-establishment of up to 30 abandoned clubs.

Builder's Club has 98 clubs including three new charters. The Big Walnut Middle School Builders Club in Sunbury met the requirements to be named as distinguished. The Builders Club of Heir Force Community School in Lima met the requirements to be named as an honor club.

K-Kids -- It's been a great year for Ohio K-Kids, too. There are 72 clubs, with 58 of them active. Three new clubs started this past year. Worldwide there are 1,136 active K-Kids with 84 new clubs built in 2024-25.

Aktion Club is thriving with 33 clubs in Ohio. Our district continues to be the Aktion Club leader in KI with the most clubs of any district throughout Kiwanis International! This year we chartered the first ever Virtual Aktion Club with 80 charter members, it has now grown to 130 members. Our largest in-person club is in Seneca County with 68 members, which is soon to be 88 members as they install 20 new members at their next meeting! There are 761 Aktion club members in Ohio. Two new clubs are being formed in Butler County and Greene County as I write this report. Big thanks to Dick Brulotte for being the amazing Aktion Club Administrator for the past six years. Welcome to new Administrator Del Ray Fox!

Our ODK Board of Directors took action to start a Historical Committee, led by Cindy Champer, and approved a District Webmaster position filled by Anthony Elbon. PR/Marketing Coordinator Cliff Wiltshire expanded our communications by re-thinking our email lists to reach more of us. We also contracted with an intern to help with the District Directory.

The big project this year was Division Realignment. For the first time since 1998, our district took on the huge task of a major division realignment. We started this past year with 24 divisions and will start the new year with 19 divisions. We also changed from division numbers to names. This was no easy task, but was necessary to equalize the size of our divisions and make them more manageable. We thank all of you for your patience and cooperation through this process.






Follow our Governor's Travels


