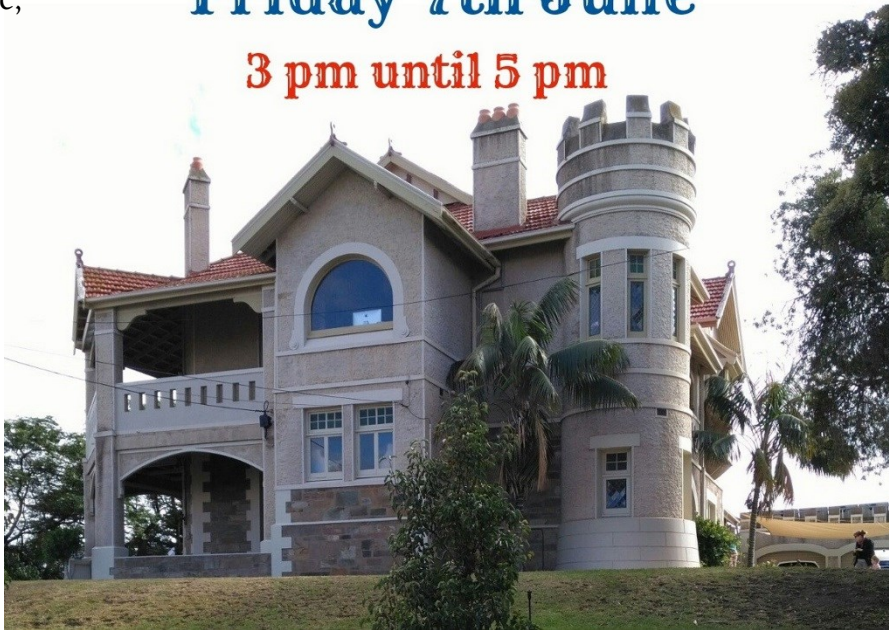

Some extra news of interest

At the May board meeting our Treasurer Peter Teagle reported all is well with our finances. He has paid our trailer registration and deposited \$77 which was from our donations box.

Peter Symons has had another visit to **Brighton Primary School** where we fund a breakfast for students—organised through St Jude's church next door. Bob Sitters with Peter are organising the new banner which will be put up in front of the church for a month at a time—it will spruik our club and also we will have something put in the school newsletter for some further publicity as it goes out to 550 parents/caregivers. We will also arrange to have a magnetic strip to be placed on their A-Frame advertising the breakfast with words to the effect of "Supported by Kiwanis Glenelg".

A date for our popular Quiz Night has been set as **2nd August**, although we don't know the dates of footy matches yet for that time of year. David Cook will again be the co-ordinator of this event with the assistance of Pam Smith and Marilyn Mitchell. Keep the date free please at this stage. It is intended that any profits gained from this night will go towards funding another frame runner, this time for young Martin. We hope to have a frame runner there on the night to show people what they are and how they operate, benefitting children with mobility issues.

Did you see the email that went out advising that our club's **Signature Project** entry has been put into the TOP 10 worldwide for clubs with over 28 members? And this was out of over 500 entries. What an achievement and we will advise how we go after final judging mid-year.

We have donated a Cotswold bench seat to The Seacliff Recreation Centre where hundreds of children gather to play various sports/gym activities. Of course they all arrive with their parents, grand-parents or carers, so there is a big opportunity for some publicity. To that end we are to be placing a sign on the seat which will say "*Donated by The Kiwanis Club of Glenelg*" and Bob Sitters is organising for that to be made. Council will install the seat. In case you haven't worked it out, Bob is our guru for getting signage made, whether it be table cloths, aprons, trophies, you name it. He has an excellent contact or two! We also often ask Christine Teagle to design something for us as she has some terrific skills and artistic abilities to do that.

President-Elect Trevor Averay had asked the Board if we could donate \$3,272 to Operation Flinders to cover the Sealink ferry fares, food/rations, the Parndana campsite accommodation, bus usage & fuel, Flinders Chase park entrance fee and adventure activities including quad biking and snorkelling etc for their Kangaroo Island trip later this year. The Board voted in favour and Trevor and another person will meet with Jonathon Robran and make the presentation and photo opportunity which will be posted on facebook and reported here in your Gumtree Gossip newsletter after it occurs.

We have paid US\$19.99 to keep our Domain Name which is a yearly fee and necessary for anyone having a website. A timely reminder to check out our newish website at: www.kiwanisglenelg.org.au It's not as big and detailed as our previous website, but it's free (other than the domain name) and all we really need these days is something for prospective members or guest speakers etc to look at to learn what our club is about. It's not just one page, go to the menu for the other pages. Val is the admin for this website and if you have anything you want included or changes you think need to be made, please send them to her.

Our second meeting in April—the 22nd April—was such a fun night. Marilyn Chandler had emailed all club members and asked if they'd like to send her a photo or two of themselves when a teenager or early twenties. There was a fabulous response and Marilyn showed the photos up on the screen and asked us to guess who that person was.

Some were easy to tell and others weren't but we all had fun seeing them all. I haven't included the photos here as I didn't ask for permissions.

Bob Sitters advised the Board that Treasure Boxes has reached out for assistance. We will donate the funds so that they can install some much needed racking for goods for children in need. The cost will be \$2,209 plus GST for the racks which will be 3 metres high and 2.25 mtrs long and there will be two. The cost includes installation. It is a policy of this Board to assist Treasure Boxes as one of our major beneficiaries. We will have our logo on the racks as well.

The Bay to Birdwood is to be held on Sunday 20th October and we have been asked to show an expression of interest in running our fabulous breakfast at the event. A bit later we will be asking for people to volunteer to help once again. This is one of our big fund-raisers and we always appreciate the opportunity to raise good funds to help children in need. Alan Blakebrough did the food ordering last year and Marilyn arranged all the rostering. However Alan will be away this time around and we are looking for somebody to co-ordinate this event—Alan has good records of numbers of all food and where to buy it, so obviously will share this with the person who volunteers to run it this year. Please speak or email to Alan or Marilyn.

David Cook has advised that he has registered our club with the People First Community Lottery recently and something will come out soon to give more information and advise how lottery tickets can be obtained. This is a great fund-raiser—no costs to us and a lot of good prizes to be won—more details when they come to hand but you can start buying tickets **now**.
